



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

Laterals = 30-70% of total I&I



Legal Authority for Private Lateral Program

- Provincial
 - Mandate: Municipal Sewage Regulation Authority: Community Charter
- Local:
 - Actions: Metro ILWRMP Municipal
 - Regulation: DNV Sewer Use Bylaw



Benefits of I&I Reduction

- 1. Accommodate OCP growth
- 2. Defer or eliminate capital projects
- 3. Anticipating Metro rate structure change
- 4. Develop DNV I&I reduction relationships
- 5. Support design for Lions Gate WWTP
- 6. Achieve our mandated ILWRMP actions
- 7. Infrastructure & environmental stewardship



Dollars and Sense – Lynn Valley

Eliminate the Problem

\$5.7M

Public Program \$3.1M

Private Program \$3.2M

Treatment Savings (\$.6)M

Equivalent increase per SFR \$29/year

Band Aid the Problem

\$13M

Metro Tank (DNV part) \$7M

Upgrade Pipes \$6M

Equivalent increase per SFR \$66/year

Total Savings

\$7.3M

Equivalent increase differential \$37/year



LV Private Lateral Program

- To reduce I&I from LV private laterals
- Estimate 5-10% of laterals require work
- In LV 10% = 540 Laterals
- Total Program Cost

\$3.2M

- Average cost per lateral \$6K
- DCC Eligible (20%)



LV Lateral Cross Connection Pilot

 Testing found 9 out of 27 storm drain laterals are contributing flow to the sanitary sewer in one of our worst areas.

The larger LV Program will solidify local information and scope of future work in the DNV.





Current DNV Actions

- Existing & New Operations Programs
 - Pipe Inspection & Repair
 - MH Inspection & Repair
 - Construction Practices
 - Inspection of Development
 - Develop Private Lateral Strategy



Private Lateral Program Approaches

- 1. Municipal Approach: We do all the work.

 Treat the private system as if it is ours.
- 2. Incentive Approach: We encourage and regulate owners to do work.

Encourage bylaw adherence through positive or negative incentive. No consequence for non adherence.

3. Regulatory Approach: We 'force' and regulate owners to do work.

Enforce owner bylaw adherence with consequence for non compliance.

Private Lateral Program Funding Approach & Rational

Municipality Pays

Otherwise taxpayers caught off guard
Unique and significant financial burden

DCC funding program candidate
