9.6. Remedial Action Requirements – 2673 Woodbine Drive, North Vancouver Non-conforming metal framed garage structure and large derelict boat

THAT











1. Council declares, pursuant to section 74 of the *Community Charter* SBC2003 c. 26, that the property at 2673 Woodbine Drive, legally described as:

PID: 005-375-525: Lot 13 Block L District Lots 598 and 599 Plan 7480

(the "Property")

is in a condition that is a nuisance to the community, due to a large open metal framed structure built without permits and a large derelict boat situated inside the structure.

- 2. Council hereby requires Alan P. Matewish, the registered owner (the "Owner") to address and remediate the above nuisance condition and bring the Property up to the standards of the Zoning, Building Regulation and Nuisance Abatement Bylaws by carrying out the following Remedial Action Requirements:
 - a) Deconstruct the large metal frame structure, including concrete foundations and completely remove them from the Property;
 - b) Remove the large derelict boat situated inside the frame of the structure from the Property; and,
 - c) Restore the Property to a neat and tidy condition.
- 3. Council directs that in the event that the Owner fails to fully comply with the Remedial Action Requirements, the District may:
 - a) take all the necessary actions to fulfil the requirements at the expense of the Owner in accordance with section 17 of the *Community Charter*, and,
 - b) that the costs of such actions shall be treated as a debt owed to the District of North Vancouver, which if unpaid at the end of this calendar year, will be added to the property taxes pursuant to section 258 of the *Community Charter;*

or

- c) seek an injunction in Supreme Court compelling the Owner to comply with the Remedial Action Requirements.
- 4. Council requires that the Remedial Action Requirements be completed by July 31, 2014.

THAT Council pass the following resolution in relation to the requested endorsements to a liquor licence:

"Be it resolved that:

1. The Council recommends the issuance of the endorsements to the liquor licence for Deep Cove Brewers and Distillers for the following reasons:

The requested liquor licence endorsements for a brewery lounge and special event area are supported by District Council as the location is located within a business park area and generally removed from residences.

This support is provided with the proviso that the permitted closing hours be 1:00am Monday to Sunday with the exterior patio closing on all nights at 10:00pm.

- 2. The Council's comments on the prescribed considerations are as follows:
 - a) The location of the brewery lounge/special event area:

The location is in a business park area removed from nearby residences and is suitable for a late evening entertainment venue and exterior patio where some late night noise at closing time can be anticipated. Any live or amplified music will be contained within the building.

b) The proximity of the brewery lounge/special event area:

The proposed location is in a business park area and will not conflict with any nearby social, recreation, or public buildings.

c) The person capacity of the brewery lounge:

The maximum capacity of 80 people within the brewery lounge area is acceptable provided closing hours are restricted to minimize any possible noise impacts on the surrounding community.

d) Hours of liquor service of the brewery lounge/special event area:

Council recommends that both liquor licence endorsements be issued with closing hours of 1:00am Monday to Sunday with an additional proviso that the exterior patio close at 10:00pm in order to reduce any potential impact on the surrounding area. These hours are intended to generally reflect the permitted hours of pub establishments in the Seymour area of the municipality.

e) Other Liquor Primary Licenses in the area are:

There are three pubs within the Seymour area: "The Raven", "Seymours", and "The Narrows" all of which provide food service and a variety of beverages. The proposed endorsement will provide for the first licenced lounge establishment in the area and fill a niche in the community for those wanting a unique and alternative venue.

f) The impact on the community if the application is approved:

As the location is in a business park area the impact on the surrounding community is expected to be minimal. A small venue serving beverages produced on-site is expected to appeal to the local community and provide a somewhat unique experience and opportunity for adult socializing.

3. The Council's comments on the views of residents are as follows:

To address the Provincial requirement staff completed the following notification procedure in accordance with District Public Notification Policy:

- A Public Notice sign was placed on the site; and,
- A notice was sent out to all adjacent property owners and occupants requesting input on the proposal.
