Unsightly Property at 1069 West 23rd Street, North Vancouver 8.3.

1. Council considers the property at 1069 West 23rd Street, legally described as

PID: 012-916-145 Lot 5 of Block 4 District Lot 552 Plan 3412 (the "Property")

to be in a condition that is so unclean as to be offensive to the community.

Therefore, pursuant to section 74 of the Community Charter, Council hereby declares the Property to be a nuisance and imposes the remedial action requirements set out in section 2 below (collectively, the "Remedial Action Requirements") on Robert and Imaculata Crossley, the registered owners of the Property (together, the "Owners") in order to address and remedy the untidy condition of the property.

- 2. The Owners are required to bring the Property up to the standard of the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw within 30 days of the receipt of the notice of the order, by carrying out the following Remedial Action Requirements:
 - a. Remove and donate re-usable items or recycle any materials including, but not limited to any salvaged construction materials, windows, lumber, cut wood, appliances, tools, gutters, racking, used paint, tires, derelict vehicles and trailer or dispose of appropriately;
 - b. Clear the Property of any accumulations of discarded items and rubbish of any kind and take to the transfer station, and including but not limited to, lifts of deteriorated pre-engineered truss joists, cupboards, boats, tarps and buckets;
 - c. Cut any overgrown vegetation and take to yard waste area of the transfer station; and
 - d. In general, make the Property neat and tidy.
- 3. Council directs that the Remedial Action Requirements specified in section 2 be completed to the satisfaction of the Chief Bylaw Officer.
- 4. Council directs that in the event that the Owners fail to fully comply with the Remedial Action

Requirements, the District may:

- a. take all necessary actions to fulfill the requirements at the expense of the Owners in accordance with s.17 of the Community Charter; and,
- b. that costs of such actions shall be treated as a debt owed to the District of North Vancouver which if unpaid at the end of this calendar year will be added to the property taxes pursuant to s. 258 of the Community Charter.
- 5. Council sets the time limit for compliance with the Remedial Action Requirements at 30 days, commencing April 19, 2013.
- 6. Council sets the time limit for a written notice of a request for Council to reconsider the Remedial Action Requirements be set at 14 days, commencing April 19, 2013.
