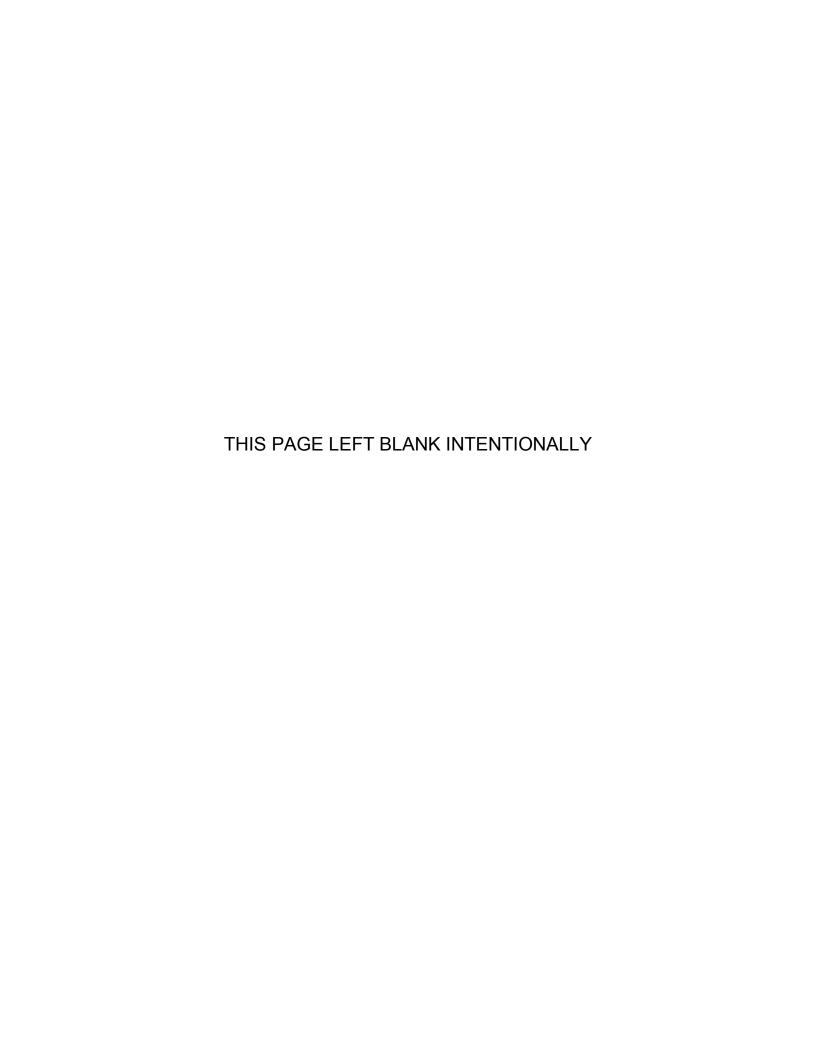

SUBJECT: RECOMMENDED MUSEUM DEACCESSIONS #3

#### RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the report of the Director of the North Vancouver Museum and Archives, dated March 20, 2015, entitled "Recommended Museum Deaccessions #3":

**THAT** Council authorizes the North Vancouver Museum and Archives (NVMA) Commission to deaccession and dispose of 243 artifacts;

**AND THAT** Council authorizes the NVMA Commission to deaccession and dispose of 662 unaccessioned objects that have been found in the Museum Collection.

#### REASON FOR REPORT:

This report seeks Council's permission for the NVMA Commission to deaccesssion and dispose of a total of 905 objects from the Museum's collection. It is the third such report submitted to Council during the course of the bi-municipally funded Collection Clean-up project (June 2012 to May 2015). Previously, Council approved the deaccessioning and disposal of 738 other objects from the Museum's collection.

#### ATTACHMENTS:

- List of 154 Museum artifacts recommended for deaccessioning and disposal owned solely by the District.
- 2. List of 79 Museum artifacts recommended for deaccessioning and disposal jointly owned by the District and the City.

List of 662 Museum artifacts found in collection storage and recommended for deaccessioning and disposal jointly owned by the District and the City.

#### DISCUSSION:

#### Deaccessions

The NVMA Commission is the sole custodian of the cultural, archival and museum collections owned by the Corporations of the City of North Vancouver and the District of North Vancouver. The Commission's Collection Policy sets out the methodology for deaccessioning (i.e.documenting and removing) materials from the accessioned collection (section B.6.8) and for documenting and disposing of other categories of objects (section B.6.9).

Items on the attached lists have been reviewed by members of the Collections Committee (Director, Assistant Director, Archivist, Collection Manager, Collection Coordinator) and approved for deaccessioning and/or disposal by the Committee and by the NVMA Commission. No single item, in the opinion of the Director, has an estimated fair market value of more than \$1,000.

Items on these lists were reviewed and approved for deaccessioning by the NVMA Commission at two different Commission meetings:

1. At its meeting on February 19, 2015, the NVMA Commission passed the following motion:

Moved by Mr. Watt and seconded by Mr. Hood:

THAT the North Vancouver Museum & Archives Commission approves the deaccessioning and/or disposal of all 1,090 objects on lists attached to the February 16, 2015 Report entitled *Recommended Museum Deaccessions #5*, and recommends to the municipal owner of each (City and/or District of North Vancouver as appropriate) that all 1,090 items be deaccessioned and disposed of according to the provisions of the Commission's Collection Policy.

2. At its meeting on March 19, 2015, the NVMA Commission passed the following motion:

Moved by Councillor Bell and seconded by Mr. Hood:

THAT the North Vancouver Museum & Archives Commission approves the deaccessioning and/or disposal of all 1,537 objects on lists attached to the March 16, 2015 Report entitled *Recommended Museum Deaccessions #6*, and recommends to the municipal owner of each (City and/or District of North Vancouver as appropriate) that all 1,537 items be deaccessioned and disposed of according to the provisions of the Commission's Collection Policy.

[NOTE: At the two Commission meetings noted above, the NVMA Commission recommended that the City and/or the District of North Vancouver Council approve the deaccessioning and/or disposal of a total of 2,627 objects. Of these, the District has full or joint ownership of the 905 objects described on the attached lists of proposed deaccessions.]

According to section D.15 of the Commission's establishing Bylaws (City of North Vancouver Bylaw No. 6019) and District of North Vancouver Bylaw No. 6789), all items recommended by the NVMA Commission for deaccession will be referred to the owner (City and/or District of North Vancouver) for final approval.

#### INTER-DEPARTMENTAL AND INTER-MUNICIPAL IMPLICATIONS:

A companion report is being prepared for submission to the Mayor and Council of the City of North Vancouver containing lists of objects owned solely by the City and recommended for deaccessioning, as well as objects owned jointly by the City and the District that are recommended for deaccessioning and unaccessioned objects owned jointly by the City and the District that are recommended for disposal.

A list of all items formally deaccessioned will be provided by the Commission to the Purchasing Department of the City of North Vancouver so the items can be deleted from their Master list and the necessary adjustments, if any, can be made to insurance coverage for the collections.

SUBJECT: Deep Cove Parking and Access - Update on Community Dialogue

#### RECOMMENDATION:

- That staff be directed to respond to input heard at the Deep Cove Community Dialogue on February 21, 2015 by proceeding with the "quick start" initiatives to improve access and parking this summer, as described in the joint report from the Transportation Planner and Manager of Strategic Communications & Community Relations; AND
- That staff be directed to report back to Council this Spring with a full report on the Deep Cove Dialogue featuring the made-in-Deep Cove Access and Parking Plan that reflects the solutions, trade-offs and compromises that were endorsed by the stakeholders.

#### REASON FOR REPORT:

District staff have completed a highly innovative, in-depth community engagement process and require Council direction to proceed with key initiatives aimed at addressing parking and access challenges in Deep Cove prior to this summer's busy season. The SFU Centre for Dialogue led the deliberative dialogue process, which involved nearly 100 residents, business owners and stakeholders.

A full, comprehensive made-in-Deep Cove Access and Parking Plan will reflect solutions, trade-offs and compromises settled upon by the community, and is scheduled to come before Council later this spring. Staff recommend that the District proceed with a number of "quick start" initiatives aimed at improving access and parking this summer.

#### SUMMARY:

Over the past few years, staff have received hundreds of emails and phone calls from residents and business owners with different perspectives on how the parking and access challenges in Deep Cove can best be addressed.

A technical study and public opinion survey were conducted in 2014, both of which went a long way toward informing our understanding of the issues and the possible solutions. The next step was to discuss the possible solutions with the community to see which had the greatest acceptance.


As a key element of the public consultation process, the Centre for Dialogue and District staff developed a discussion guide that outlined the perspectives and arguments for and against the possible solutions. The Deep Cove Deliberative Dialogue event was held on February 21, 2014. Throughout, stakeholders considered different viewpoints, ideas, impacts of possible solutions, and trade-offs that would be required. Based on their dialogue, participants developed a principled decision-making framework that municipal staff will be able to use over the coming years to arbitrate future difficult conversations about the best way to address parking and access challenges in Deep Cove.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Deep Cove is enjoyed by different stakeholders in different ways.

- For residents, the village provides the advantages of a small community, combined with access to recreational and cultural opportunities and close proximity to downtown Vancouver.
- For outdoor enthusiasts, it acts as a trailhead for Quarry Rock and the Baden-Powell Trail, as well as a rare access point to the waterfront in North Vancouver.
- For residents of Indian Arm who access their homes by boat, it serves as a gateway to daily life in Metro Vancouver.
- A number of businesses and nonprofit organizations help to complete the Deep Cove community, ranging from restaurants to performing arts organizations. These institutions are supported by patronage from both residents and visitors, including a growing number of domestic and international tourists. A range of festivals and outdoor events add to this economic and social fabric, with the peak in activity taking place during the summer months.



Reasons people come to Deep Cove

According to Tourism Vancouver, Metro Vancouver received a record number of visitors in 2014, with 5 percent growth. Many locals report an increase in visitors to Deep Cove that outpaces even these regional statistics. Outside interest in Deep Cove continues to rise while the capacity of the community itself has remained relatively unchanged.

Given Deep Cove's unique situation, the following vision statement seemed to resonate with stakeholders at the Dialogue as reflective of the nature and outlook of the community:

"Deep Cove is a small local, waterfront-oriented village centre. Neither significant growth nor major physical changes are anticipated."

#### ANALYSIS:

#### **Public Consultation:**

The District, through consultants, conducted a public opinion survey concurrent with a parking and access technical study last year. The results helped staff understand the variety of viewpoints, wealth of ideas, suggestions, and concerns held by people in Deep Cove about access and parking. Our understanding of the issues and how much they matter to residents was also informed by the hundreds of emails that were received.

The challenge to finding a path forward on this complex issue provided staff with an opportunity to follow through on Council's direction to be proactive and take a more innovative approach to public consultation. As well, the process sought to fulfil Council's request to hear from a broader range of voices when seeking public feedback.

After exploring three different consultative approaches, the District engaged the SFU Centre for Dialogue in December 2014 to begin planning a community consultation about parking and access in Deep Cove. A major advantage of using the Centre for Dialogue's 'deliberative dialogue' approach is that it provides the opportunity for participants to hear different perspectives, identify areas of compromise, and find solutions that work for the entire community. This type of process differs greatly from a typical town hall or public meeting scenario, which can be useful in certain contexts, but can also create a structure that is inherently adversarial. Nearly 100 stakeholders participated in the dialogue session and worked together to evaluate trade-offs and understand where there was general consensus around solutions.

The Deep Cove Dialogue on Access and Parking was held on Saturday, February 21 at Seycove Secondary. Registration was managed by the Centre for Dialogue. A balance of interests was ensured so that each table had representation from all of the stakeholder interest areas. The session was run entirely by the Centre for Dialogue, using District staff as support. The day began at 10 am and finished at 3:30 pm. At the conclusion of the event, 93 percent of participants said they were interested in participating in similar events in the future.

#### Public Awareness and Promotion:

A comprehensive program was executed to ensure that people affected by parking and access in Deep Cove were aware of the opportunity to participate in the dialogue session. These included: residents of Deep Cove, residents of Indian Arm, business and non-profit operators, and recreational visitors. The following public awareness tactics were used to reach these stakeholders:

- · Posters at businesses and in public buildings in the Deep Cove area;
- On-street signage in over 20 locations around Deep Cove, including the main commercial area and recreation access points;
- Postcard mail drop in the Deep Cove and Indian River Drive area;
- Postcard mail drop to Indian Arm residents within District boundaries;
- Inter-governmental communications with Electoral Area A and Belcarra Directors, and Metro Vancouver staff to reach non DNV boat-access-only Indian Arm residents;
- Door-to-door canvassing of businesses and non-profit organizations in Deep Cove Village;
- Paid advertisements in the North Shore News and Deep Cove Crier;
- Mayor's column in Deep Cove Crier (Jan and Feb);
- Social media, including paid facebook boosts targeting regional recreational visitors who are less active in Deep Cove during winter months;
- Direct outreach to citizens who had previously contacted us on the issue;
- Targeted promotion to relevant organizations, such as business improvement associations, neighbourhood associations, hiking communities, film production companies, tourism organizations;
- Principal at Seycove Secondary was asked to invite youth aged 15 and older; and
- Extensive earned media coverage.

The discussion guide was provided online with an opportunity to provide input through the District's web site, for those unable to attend the dialogue session in person.

#### Reporting out:

One of the most essential aspects of effective public consultation is reporting back to participants about the outcome and how their input helped shape solutions and plans being brought forward to Council. The Centre for Dialogue's report is currently being finalized and will provide transparency on the discussion that took place, the input and ideas received, and the level of support the various solutions received from the participants themselves.

Staff anticipates that the final Deep Cove Access and Parking Plan and the Centre for Dialogue's full report will be available for the April 20 Council meeting. At which time, it will be important to report back to the community on outcomes.

#### Capacity Building:

The opportunity for the District to learn from this experience was leveraged enormously by choosing two dozen young and mid-career staff from across the organization to participate in the dialogue session as table facilitators and note-takers. The staff participants were chosen

jointly by Communications and Executive for professional development and their demonstrated attitude towards change and innovation.

This group of employees received invaluable training from the Centre for Dialogue to prepare for their roles. The result is an increased capacity amongst our staff for effective and innovative dialogue to get to the bottom of an issue that has multiple possible solutions. The experience has also provided the employees with skills they might not otherwise develop in their day-to-day work or at this stage in their careers.

#### **Next Steps:**

Staff recommend using the existing \$100,000 budget to implement the following "quick start" initiatives for this year's summer busy season. The key actions are grouped into themes that emerged through the public process.

# **EARLY FINDINGS REPORT MARCH 11, 2015**





#### **DOCUMENT PURPOSE**

This document is written by Simon Fraser University's Centre for Dialogue in cooperation with the District of North Vancouver. It presents key information and early findings from the Deep Cove Parking and Access Community Dialogue, which took place on February 21, 2015. A complete event summary will be published in April 2015.

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# 1 EVENT PURPOSE

The February 21 Deep Cove Parking and Access Community Dialogue provided a rare opportunity for residents, non-profits, outdoor enthusiasts, local businesses, and other stakeholders to collaborate with the District of North Vancouver in shaping public policy.

The dialogue followed a formal resolution by the District of North Vancouver Council to engage the community-at-large in a deliberative process. The District asked Simon Fraser University's Centre for Dialogue to independently design and facilitate this process, with the goal of producing a made-in-Deep Cove plan for presentation to Council in the spring of 2015. Pending Council approval, this plan would lead directly to the implementation of viable, short-term parking and access changes in advance of summer 2015, with other changes implemented over longer timelines.

To facilitate the creation of a made-in-Deep Cove plan, the Centre for Dialogue asked stakeholders to place themselves in the shoes of a city planner, with full information about potential solutions and constraints. To this end, the Centre worked with the District to author a discussion guide to provide a factual basis for conversations about parking and access in Deep Cove. The guide also presented a wide range of stakeholder perspectives to inform the dialogue process, based on interviews, research, and previous public input.

A major advantage of this dialogue-based approach was the opportunity for stakeholders to hear different perspectives and identify potential areas for compromise. This type of process differs significantly from traditional town hall meetings, which, although serving a necessary and important purpose in certain contexts, create a structure of engagement that is inherently adversarial.

Parking and access in Deep Cove deeply affects the daily lives of many individuals, and can be a personal and controversial topic. Despite these challenges, many participants rose to the occasion and worked across individual perspectives to identify solutions that were in the best interest of the entire community. The overall tone of the dialogue was respectful and productive, with 93% of participants indicating that they would be interested in attending similar events in the future.

# **OUTREACH AND REGISTRATION**

The District of North Vancouver and SFU Centre for Dialogue worked together to identify and promote the dialogue to all primary stakeholder groups affected by parking and access in Deep Cove. These include residents of Deep Cove, residents of Indian Arm, business and non-profit operators, and recreational visitors. The project team employed a variety of communications methods to reach these stakeholders, including:


- 1. On-street signage in over 20 locations throughout Deep Cove, including at trailheads, the Seycove Marina entrance, and around the commercial zone.
- 2. Postcard mail drops within the Deep Cove Village area.
- 3. Postcard mail drops to Indian Arm residents within District boundaries.
- 4. Inter-governmental communications with Electoral Area A and Belcarra to reach Indian Arm residents in those jurisdictions.
- 5. Door-to-door canvassing of businesses and non-profits in the Deep Cove Village.
- 6. Paid advertisements in the North Shore News and the Deep Cove Crier.
- 7. Social media, including paid Facebook boosts targeting recreational users, who are less present in Deep Cove during winter months.
- 8. Direct outreach to citizens who previously registered interest in the issue.
- 9. Targeted promotion to relevant organizations, such as business improvement associations, neighbourhood associations, hiking communities, film production companies, tourism organizations, etc.
- 10. A request for Seycove Secondary School to identify and invite youth aged 15 and older.
- 11. Mayor's column in Deep Cove Crier (January and February editions).

To ensure balanced representation, the Centre for Dialogue implemented a quota system for each stakeholder group. Registrants within each stakeholder group were accepted on a first-come, first-served basis with a target of hosting 100 total participants after attrition. An online feedback option was provided by the District for individuals unable to attend the dialogue. Final participant demographics are provided in the next section.

# 3 PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

Ninety-seven participants attended the Deep Cove Parking and Access Community Dialogue. All participants provided demographic and other information through a pre-dialogue survey. This demographic information allowed event organizers to confirm the participant composition and to better understand the perspectives of individual stakeholder groups during later dialogue activities.


FIG 1. STAKEHOLDER REPRESENTATION (PRIMARY INTEREST)




The pre-dialogue survey asked participants to self-identify their primary interest for parking and access within the Deep Cove Parking Study Area, selecting one option only. This data provides the primary source for information about stakeholder representation and for breaking down quantitative survey results by stakeholder group.

# FIG 2. FULL RANGE OF PARTICIPANT INTERESTS (PRIMARY AND SECONDARY)

The pre-dialogue survey also asked participants to self-identify any secondary interests in the event topic. When combined with participants' primary interest, the results demonstrate that most participants had multiple interests related to parking and access in Deep Cove. Secondary interests also support further analysis about the representation and perspectives of specific stakeholder groups (e.g. residents inside the Panorama Drive resident parking only zone).




# FIG 3. REPRESENTATION OF DEEP COVE RESIDENTS



Approximately 60% of participants selfidentified as living inside Deep Cove (inside or outside the parking study area).


FIG 4. SHARE OF PARTICIPANTS BY AGE GROUP

Figure 5 shows the composition of a typical breakout table. Event organizers used registration data to pre-assign at least one member of each major stakeholder group to all tables.





This section outlines the major themes and findings emerging from the Deep Cove Parking and Access Community Dialogue. For the purpose of this report, a "theme" is defined as an action or solution proposed by at least four breakout tables. These solutions represent areas of agreement that emerged after several hours of perspective sharing and deliberation between diverse stakeholders. Within each theme, we present the full list of suggested actions to surface variations in approach. As much as possible, actions are presented in participants' own words. Some actions are listed more than once where they correspond to more than one theme.

Participants filled out post-dialogue surveys to provide a score out of seven for each action explored in the dialogue Discussion Guide, with a score of one indicating "strongly against" and a score of seven indicating "strongly in favour." These results reflect participants' individual rather than group perspectives. Average scores have been grouped and presented under the same themes as the table solutions. In all cases, Centre for Dialogue staff have verified that these averages are not skewed by minority viewpoints. Where relevant, the results are broken down by stakeholder group. Due to the complexity of topics involving Panorama Drive, we present additional information about the percentage of participants-at-large in favour and against different potential actions in this section.

Broad support among stakeholder groups is a major criterion for shaping the plan that goes forward to District of North Vancouver Council. Not all themes mentioned in this section have equal levels of support among participants-at-large or by individual stakeholder groups. Where such variations in support exist, we explicitly highlight these in a theme's introductory paragraph.

Standard District of North Vancouver decision-making criteria—such as a solution's impact on parking availability, cost, implementation timeframe, and demonstrated feasibility—are also important factors in shaping the final plan that goes forward to Council. Participants explicitly considered these criteria during their deliberations. The District will further consider these criteria when making parking and access changes in Deep Cove.

# THEME: MAXIMIZE USE OF OVERFLOW LOTS, INCLUDING BETTER SIGNS AND COMMUNICATION

Twelve out of 13 tables proposed ideas to maximize the use of overflow parking. These ideas included providing better physical signage, making school parking lots available outside of school hours, and using digital outreach (e.g. apps, websites). Post-survey results indicate strong support for improved wayfinding signs to overflow lots.

# **Relevant Group Proposals**



"Maximize + optimize access to overflow parking, including: Myrtle Park, Covecliff (field), and Seycove Secondary (by improving signage)."



"More Parking - Open school lots for overflow parking."

"Better Signage - Directing people to overflow lots. Also update maps and request that hiking/recreational websites include information about overflow lots."



"Better signage for overflow parking, considering both cars and pedestrians."

"Use School District 44 parking lots and perhaps gravel fields for peak periods, or on regular basis (overnight, weekends)."



"Using available lots (schools) and improve signage to these lots."



"Clear and more signage (e.g. improvements to the clarity, frequency, and number of signs, plus including maps on signs with "you are here" dots)."

"Optimize already available parking - through existing landscaping, ditches, micro parking projects (gravel parking), use of overflow parking, etc."

"Deep Cove app, with maps, business info, parking info, etc."



"Proper, clear signage for overflow parking lots."



"Way-finding signage to overflow parking lots."



"Very clear parking signage for visitors within Deep Cove, as well as signage prior to arrival into Deep Cove directing visitors to trail heads and alternate parking."

"Better and offsite parking options."



"Create a new Deep Cove App."

"Improved engineering and use of our existing space - better signage and linage toward overflow areas."



"School District 44 should open up school parking lots for evenings and weekends."



"Create signage for overflow lots."



"Quick and cost effective use of existing overflow lots. Clear trail markers. Encourage use with better signage."

# THEME: REVIEW RULES AND SOLUTIONS FOR PANORAMA DRIVE PARKING

Ten out of 13 tables proposed either to review the rules for the trial Panorama Drive Resident Parking Only (RPO) zone or to provide additional parking options for Indian Arm residents.

Post-dialogue survey results indicate that participants-at-large were slightly to moderately in favour of both making the trial RPO zone permanent and adjusting the RPO rules to better accommodate Indian Arm residents. Support to expand the pool of parking permits available to Indian Arm residents was highest among Indian Arm residents, while further data analysis indicates Panorama Drive residents were evenly split for and against this direction (5B-ii, 5B-iii, 5C).

The option receiving the highest support by participants-at-large was to encourage the Marina to address its parking deficit (1C). The option least supported by Panorama Drive residents was to raise the cost of parking permits to reduce demand (5B-i). The option least supported by Indian Arm residents was to work towards alternate docking options in Belcarra (5E).

# **Relevant Group Proposals**

Redistributing or increasing parking passes for Indian Arm residents



"Equal distribution of RPO's for Indian Arm & Panorama residents. Each household would get one resident pass and one guest pass."



"Reconfigure or terminate Panorama Drive Resident Parking Only zone. Any RPO should provide priority to groups and individuals with proven needs (e.g. Panorama residents without private parking options or Indian Arm residents who have more than one car and lack alternatives)."



"Expand resident parking only area to Banbury (if it's okay with residents on that street to expand) and towards Cove Cliff School. Provide parking permits for Deep Cove and Indian Arm residents. Residents get 1 free visitor pass."



"Keep RPO plan (passes)
permanent, but provide passes
for Indian Arm residents (with
tiered fees to make up for fact
that Indian Arm residents aren't
all taxpayers)."



"Indian Arm Residents / Panorama Residents - Both groups should get on-street parking permits for Panorama Drive. They should be treated the same and receive the same type of passes."

# Providing other parking options for Indian Arm residents



"Redevelop Marina to create extra parking for core visitors and Indian Arm residents."



"Help to fund parking spots at the Marina."



"More Parking - Build a parkade at the Seycove Marina."

"More Parking - The District recently purchased two housing lots near the entrance to the Baden-Powell Trail and used this to create green space. This space should instead be turned into a parking lot for Indian Arm residents, disabled visitors, and visitors to the pharmacy / doctor's office."



"Encourage more parking @ the Marina, with the District looking at more creative solutions to assist in this matter."



"Overnight parking for Indian Arm residents & guests in existing parking lots."

"Encourage DNV & Marina to pursue increase of Marina parking for boat access only Indian Arm residents."

### Other



"Include Indian Arm residents in Panorama Drive RPO for now (with long-term desire to redevelop Marina and create parking for Indian Arm residents there)."



"Selective RPO on Panorama Drive to restrict home owners from providing passes to illegal suits."



"Panorama Drive resident only parking (group could not reach full consensus on further inclusion of Indian Arm residents)."



"Solution to Panorama friction: only residents of Panorama and Indian Arm have access to parking along Panorama. Relocate existing resources. Permits?"




Encourage the Marina to address its parking deficit by building more parking or by using satellite parking with valet services.




# **DISCUSSION GUIDE ACTION 5B**

Find new ways to share parking spaces on Panorama Drive between Panorama Drive residents and Indian Arm boat-only access residents.


Sub-Action 5B-i. Raise the cost of parking for all permit classes on Panorama Drive to free up capacity. The number of permits issued would be capped and monitored.




## 35 NEXT STEPS

Many of the themes in this Early Findings Report have broad support among stakeholder groups and clearly constitute a made-in-Deep Cove parking and access plan. Other themes provide a general mandate for action, but require additional judgement by the District of North Vancouver to account for missing details and technical constraints.

Next steps for the District include implementing "quick start" parking and access changes in advance of the summer 2015 high season. The Centre for Dialogue will publish its full dialogue report in April 2015, including further event context and analysis. This information should be useful to the District of North Vancouver for refining its detailed implementation plan and determining longer-term priorities.

Traffic Calming for Sunset Boulevard - 3546 to 3983 Sunset Boulevard

#### RECOMMENDATION:

 Pursuant to Section 211 of the Community Charter, a local area service project for the construction of traffic calming works on Sunset Boulevard be approved; and

2) Bylaw 8093 be now read a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME.

#### REASON FOR REPORT:

At the October 20, 2014 Council meeting, staff presented a report informing Council that a local area service petition for Sunset Boulevard was received and validated by the Municipal Clerk's Office on September 15, 2014. After Council's consideration of the report which included a discussion on alternative traffic calming measures, the following motion was passed.

THAT the report from the Supervisor – Transportation Engineering regarding traffic calming on Sunset Boulevard dated October 8, 2014 be received for information;

AND THAT staff be directed to undertake a broad public consultation that will include all stakeholders; and,

AND FINALLY THAT the results of that consultation be reported back to Council prior to consideration of Local Area Service Bylaw 8093.

#### SUMMARY:

A petition to undertake the installation of traffic calming measures on Sunset Boulevard was received and validated by the Municipal Clerk's office on September 15, 2014. The proposed local improvement area on Sunset Boulevard extends from approximately Loraine Avenue to Emerald Drive. Of the 44 benefiting property owners, 32 (or 73 percent) of the residents signed in favour of the petition. Attachment 1 shows the local improvement area as well as the residents that voted in favour of the petition.

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The proposed work includes the installation of four asphalt speed humps and one raised crosswalk at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and Emerald Drive, complete with all signage and pavement markings.

The adjacent property owners would be responsible for 100 percent of the costs to install the proposed traffic calming measures. The estimated total cost per property owner is \$572.46 which would be recovered by means of a parcel tax spread over a five-year period, at an annual cost of \$125.90. The total cost for this project is estimated at \$25,200.

Following the request by Council to engage the broader community, staff held an open house at the District Hall on January 27, 2015 to present the proposed traffic calming plan and to respond to questions and concerns from the residents.

#### BACKGROUND:

In accordance with the District of North Vancouver's Traffic Calming Policy (Policy No. 11-8620-1), provided there is two-thirds support (66.67 percent), residents of a neighbourhood may elect to fund agreed-upon traffic calming measures on local or collector roads through a local area service petition. Property owners within the designated local service area on Sunset Boulevard have expressed an interest in improving safety and the liveability of their neighbourhood by reducing vehicle speeds.

At the property owners' request, engineering staff worked with the residents to develop a traffic calming plan. The plan includes four (4) asphalt speed humps and one (1) raised crosswalk at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and Emerald Drive. Refer to Attachment 2 for details.

The petition is in compliance with Section 212 of the Community Charter and was certified by the Municipal Clerk on September 15, 2014; therefore, the works may proceed as a "Local Area Service Project" subject to Council's adoption of a construction bylaw.

The Community Charter regulates local area service projects and as required under Section 211 of the Charter, Council shall, before adopting the construction bylaw, have a report stating:

- a) Description of the service,
- b) Definition of the boundaries of the Local Service Area,
- c) Identification of the methods of cost recovery for the service, including the form of local service tax and the portion of the costs of service that are to be recovered by the local service tax, and
- d) If applicable, the portion of the costs of the service that is to be recovered by a general property tax.

#### **EXISTING POLICY:**

Under Division 5 of the Community Charter, a local area service project may be achieved by Council Initiative (Section 213), or by Petition to Council (Section 212).

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This petition has met the criteria of Section 212, "Petition to Council for Local Area Service" which states in part:

- The petition must be signed by the owners of at least 50 percent of the parcels that would be subject to the local service tax;
- The persons signing must be the owners of parcels that in total represent at least 50 percent of the assessed value of land and improvements that would be subject to the local service tax.

In accordance with the Corporate Policy on Traffic Calming (Policy No. 11-8620-1), the District shall use traffic calming as a means to, "improve the quality of life of the residents, incorporate their requirements and preferences, and create safe and attractive streets."

In January, 2012, the Traffic Calming Policy was amended to allow for the implementation of traffic calming measures on Collector Roads through a local area service petition. Prior to this, only Local Roads qualified for a local area service project. The Traffic Calming Policy also requires that two-thirds of the residents support the proposed traffic calming plan.

#### ANALYSIS:

- In 2012 and 2013, staff measured vehicle volumes and speeds, and conducted field investigations on this section of Sunset Boulevard. The street is classified as a Collector Road and carries average two-way weekday traffic volumes in the order of 2,800 vehicles per day. Typical traffic volumes on collector roads range from 1,000 to 8,000 vehicles daily, therefore Sunset Boulevard's traffic volumes are relatively low.
- The posted speed limit is 50 km/hr and the measured 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speeds ranged from 54 to 57 km/hr. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed is the speed at or below which 85 percent of drivers travel. The 57 km/h 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed poses safety concerns for residents on the street. It should also be noted that there is a 30 km/hr advisory speed limit posted for the horizontal road curve close to Hillcrest Avenue.
- While a review of the accident history did not show a significant number of vehicle crashes, residents have reported that there have been a number of close calls resulting from high vehicle speeds and restricted sight lines at driveways and intersection corners
- On January 28, 2014, staff met with a large group of Sunset Boulevard residents to review a proposed traffic calming plan consisting of four (4) speed humps and one (1) raised crosswalk that the majority of the residents supported.

As per the current Traffic Calming Policy, speed humps may be considered for collector roads if the average traffic volume is less than 5,000 vehicles daily and it is not a bus route. Sunset Boulevard carries an average of 2,800 vehicles a day and is not a bus route, therefore speed humps may be installed.

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Speed humps and speed tables or raised crosswalks have very different characteristics in terms of their impact on vehicles. The longer length of the speed tables or raised crosswalks (7 metres wide) provides for a gentler ride as compared to speed humps that are more abrupt (4 metres wide) and they generally result in vehicle operating speeds of between 40 to 48 km/h and 28 to 32 km/h respectively, when travelling over these devices.

With the proposed design and speed hump spacing, it is reasonable to expect 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speeds between the humps of approximately 45 to 50 km/h, which should not result in significant delays to drivers travelling on this street.

Other traffic calming options were considered for Sunset Boulevard such as:

- curb extensions,
- · traffic circles, and/or
- painted slow legends.

However, as residents must fund this work, speed humps and a raised crosswalk would be the most cost-effective devices that would most likely achieve the desired speed reductions. Both the residents and staff support this approach.

Staff concluded that the proposed traffic calming measures will not likely result in a significant shift in traffic patterns. The proposed measures represent a reasonable and appropriate installation for this street that will reduce overall vehicle speeds.

#### Timing/Approval Process:

The property owners have requested that the proposed traffic calming works be installed as soon as possible. There would be potential benefit in implementing these measures prior to the Capilano Road water main project due to the anticipated diversion of traffic during construction (scheduled to start August 2015).

#### Financial Impacts:

Based on our current policy for traffic calming on local and collector roads, the property owners are to pay 100 percent of the installation costs for the traffic calming works, including the cost of signage and pavement markings.

The District's contribution includes the engineering design and maintenance costs that include for example, the painting of the speed hump markings and occasional signage repairs.

The District will be front-ending the capital needed for the improvements and costs incurred will be completely recovered from the benefiting property owners. The charges can be paid by the owners after the works have been completed in full, without interest or by annual instalments over a five-year period.

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#### Public Input:

73 percent of the owners living within the local improvement area along the 3500-3900 blocks of Sunset Boulevard signed the petition supporting the implementation of traffic calming works on their street.

Conversely, correspondence was received from residents who live outside of the local improvement area who do not support the traffic calming measures. The reason for this opposition appears to centre primarily on inconvenience, potential back-ups, shifting of traffic patterns and increased travel times.

A summary of the actual comments can be found in Appendix A. Attachment 3 illustrates the percentage breakdown of residents that support and do not support the traffic calming measures both within and outside of the local service area. It should be noted that the majority of the emails and comments used to determine the percentage illustration for residents outside of the local service area were received prior to the open house held on January 27, 2015.

#### Open House - January 27, 2015

As per the motion passed at the October 20, 2014 Council meeting, staff engaged the broader community and invited approximately 400 residents from the surrounding neighbourhood to an Open House held on January 27, 2015. A total of 35 residents that live both inside and outside of the local service area attended the event. Attachment 4 shows the catchment area for the residents invited to the open house.

The open house provided residents with an opportunity to learn more about the project through an array of display boards and allowed them to express their concerns and ask staff questions. Residents were also given the opportunity to provide their comments through comment sheets and emails. In summary, the primary concerns for those residents who lived outside of the area included:

- speed humps would be an inconvenience,
- they are unnecessary,
- they may divert traffic to other streets; and/or
- · they may increase travel times.

There was also considerable discussion on the use of other forms of traffic calming including curb extensions, a reduced speed limit, painted slow legends and police enforcement, for example. Staff advised the residents that enforcement is not a practical or cost-effective solution and that the other measures would not achieve the desired overall reduction in vehicles speeds.

Based on the comments received at the open house, there was a slight majority of residents that did not favour the proposed traffic calming plan. A summary of the actual comments can be found in Appendix B.

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A copy of the proposed traffic calming plan was also forwarded to the District Fire Department.

#### Conclusion:

The proposed traffic calming project for Sunset Boulevard meets all of the requirements under the District's current Traffic Calming Policy and Under Division 5 of the Community Charter whereby a local area service project may be achieved by Council Initiative (Section 213), or by Petition to Council (Section 212). This petition has met the criteria of Section 212, "Petition to Council for Local Area Service".

It should also be noted that Metro Vancouver is proposing a water main replacement project along Capilano Road from Edgemont Boulevard to Dam Road that is scheduled to commence this summer. Since Sunset Boulevard is the only continuous north/south route alternative to Capilano Road, west of Highland Boulevard, it is important to consider the potential benefits of traffic calming along Sunset Boulevard while traffic is displaced from Capilano Road for the Metro Vancouver Water Main Project.








Attachment 3 - Public Input from Inside and Outside the Area

#### Bylaw 8093

A bylaw to establish a local area service of generally constructing lane improvement works for the benefit of a part of the District of North Vancouver (LIP 2014-02; Speed Humps - Northeast of 3546 Sunset Boulevard to 3983 Sunset Boulevard)

WHEREAS section 210 of the *Community Charter* authorizes a municipality to establish a local area service for the particular benefit of a part of the municipality, to be paid for in whole or in part by a property value tax or a parcel tax, or both, imposed only within the local service area:

WHEREAS pursuant to section 212 of the *Community Charter*, the owners of parcels within the Local Service Area (as defined in this bylaw) have submitted a sufficient and valid petition proposing the construction of asphalt speed humps, complete with road markings, signage and other works as necessary ("The Works") on Sunset Boulevard northeast of 3546 Sunset Boulevard to 3983 Sunset Boulevard as shown on "Schedule A" appended to this bylaw; and,

WHEREAS the Council for the District of North Vancouver wishes to provide the local area service contemplated in this bylaw and considers that such service will provide particular benefit to the Local Service Area;

The Council for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver enacts as follows:

#### 1. Citation

This bylaw may be cited as "Speed Humps – Northeast of 3546 Sunset Boulevard to 3983 Sunset Boulevard Bylaw 8093, 2014".

#### 2. Establishment of Local Area Service

The District hereby establishes the service of the construction and installation of The Works in accordance with the District's current engineering standards and specifications for the benefit of the Local Service Area described in section 3 of this bylaw. The following will be included in the cost of The Works as necessary:

- all hard construction costs;
- ii. engineering and administration expenses;
- iii. cost of advertising and mailing of notices;

- iv. interest on temporary loans and discount and expenses relating to security issuing bylaws;
- compensation for land taken for the purpose of the Works or injuriously affected by it and for the expenses incurred by the corporation in connection with determining such compensation; and,
- vi. cost to acquire all such property, easements, rights-of-way, licences, rights or authorities that may be requisite or desirable for and in connection with the construction of The Works.

#### 3. Local Area Service Boundaries

The Local Service Area includes all of the parcels within the area outlined in bold on the plan attached to and forming part of this bylaw as "Schedule A".

#### 4. Proportion of the Cost of the Works to be Specially Charged

The share or proportion of the total cost of The Works which will be specially charged against the parcels in the Local Service Area is 100%.

#### 5. Cost Recovery Method

The total cost of providing the service established under section 2 of this bylaw is estimated to be \$25,188.00 with 100% of the cost charged against the parcels in the Local Service Area. A parcel tax will be imposed for the recovery of the final cost on the basis of a single equal amount for each parcel calculated by dividing the final cost among each of the forty-four (44) parcels. Parcel tax will be imposed for a 5 year repayment period including interest.

Option for payout to be provided upon authentication of Parcel Tax Roll.

#### 6. Parcel Tax Assessment Roll

A Parcel Tax Roll shall be prepared for the purpose of imposing the parcel tax on each of the parcels in the Local Service Area based on a single equal amount per parcel determined in accordance with Local Improvement Cost Sharing Bylaw 3711.



Want to see evidence from prior projects, showing traffic will not divert to other roads.

Totally supports the plan. Also suggests a 3-way Stop at Ruby and Sunset and a dedicated bike lane.

Speed hump just before Hillcrest coming down Sunset should be closer to Hillcrest.

Whatever it takes to reduce traffic speed and volume should be pursued.

For rapid and safe egress from Edgewood to Capilano - need a signal light. This could relieve a lot of pressure on Sunset Boulevard.

Takes longer way down Sunset because of the difficulty of accessing Capilano. Remedy: Install a traffic light at Capilano and Edgewood.

Not in favour. Speed humps will cause extreme hazards, noise and problems for travellers. Surely there is another alternative.



**DEVELOPMENT PERMIT 17.14** 

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That Development Permit 17.14 (Attachment A) for a mixed commercial/residential project, including 41 residential units, at 1041-1069 Marine Drive, be issued.


#### REASON FOR REPORT:

The project site is in Development Permit Areas for Form and Character of Commercial and Mixed-Use Buildings and for Energy and Water Conservation and Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction. This development permit report outlines the project's compliance with the applicable Development Permit Area guidelines.

#### SUMMARY:

The proposal is for a 4 storey, mixed-use building with 4 commercial units at grade and 41 apartment units on three upper floors. Parking is provided both underground and on the surface with access off the rear lane. The subject site is currently occupied by one and two storey at-grade commercial development.

The proposal is in compliance with the Official Community Plan and the Schedule B Development Permit Area Guidelines and Development Permit 17.14 is now ready for consideration of issuance.



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#### EXISTING POLICY:

#### Land Use Designation/Zoning

The site is designated 'Commercial Residential Mixed Use Level 1' in the District's Official Community Plan which permits a mix of commercial and residential uses up to approximately 1.75 FSR. The site is zoned Marine Drive Commercial (C9) Zone and the project complies with the zone regulations with the exception of a height variance for a portion of the roof, a 1% variance to building coverage, and a reduction in residential vehicle parking. The proposed variances are included in Development Permit 17.14.

#### **Development Permit Area Designations**

The site is within Development Permit Areas for the following purposes:

- Form and Character of Commercial and Mixed-Use Buildings; and
- Energy and Water Conservation and Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction.

#### ANALYSIS:

#### The Site and Surrounding Area:

The development site is approximately 2,292.7m<sup>2</sup> (24,679 sq ft) in area and is comprised of one lot located on the south side of Marine Drive between Lloyd Avenue to the west and

Mackay Road to the east. Currently the site is occupied by an aging one and two storey retail building with street parking along Marine Drive, and additional parking accessed by way of an existing rear lane to the south.

Surrounding land uses consist of developed commercial lots, zoned Marine Drive Commercial (C9) Zone, to the west north and south and the Indigo Building zoned CD21 directly adjacent to the east. Further to the south are light industrial properties zoned EZLI.



## SUBJECT: 1041-1069 MARINE DRIVE (Integra Architecture Inc.) DEVELOPMENT PERMIT 17.14

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#### The Project:

The project is a 4 storey, mixed-use commercial and residential building consisting of 666 m<sup>2</sup> (7169 sq ft) of ground level commercial space with 41 apartment units on the upper three floors. The commercial units are oriented to Marine Drive with a courtyard entrance and breezeway access through to the rear lane.



The residential units feature a mix of two studio units, 15 one bedroom units (2 with dens), 22 two bedroom units (9 with dens) and two three bedroom units (one with den and one with additional storage). The units will range in size from 43.2m2 (465 sq ft) to 120.9 m2 (1302 sq ft) with the average size being 70m2 (819 sq ft). The total floor area results in an FSR of 1.75, in compliance with the OCP and the C9 Zone.

To create a transition from the Indigo Building to the east the architect has aligned the streetwall of the proposed building at the northeast corner of the site (as outlined) and



introduced two columns at the corner to reflect the brick finish and design of the adjacent building. The columns are repeated along the front façade of the building defining both the entrance to the breezeway and the individual commercial units. Stone cladding, concrete panelling and metal materials are proposed in order to create a unique identity for the building.

The stepping-back of the upper levels of residential, and the steel and glass overhangs to provide continuous weather protection, will create a strong retail presence along Marine Drive and contribute to a successful pedestrian experience in compliance with the objectives of the Marine Drive Design guidelines.

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The introduction of landscaping and patterned paving along Marine Drive will lead the pedestrian into the mid-block breezeway that will offer both a landscaped public space with seating and lobby access to the building.

The south elevation of the building along the existing lane has a landscaped green wall that will screen and soften the exterior parking level to both the lane and future development to the south. Landscaped decks for units at the 2<sup>nd</sup> level and an outdoor amenity common space screen the parking from above.

#### Site Access:


The applicant is proposing a shared exterior commercial/visitor parking level as well as a secured underground parking area for tenants. Both parking areas are accessed from the existing open lane at the south side of the site. Additional street parking is provided along Marine Drive.

The two entrances to the exterior parking level and underground residential parking are separated by the pedestrian breezeway leading to Marine Drive.

The applicant has proposed the installation of an exterior lift adjacent to the breezeway stairs to ensure full accessibility of this area.







Site Plan/Landscape Plan

The building is set back 5.8m (19 ft) from the Marine Drive curb to provide both the required 4m (13ft.) setback from the curb in the C9 Zone plus an additional 2m (6.6ft.) for any future extension of the Marine Drive bus lane. The rear (south) setback is 6m (20ft.) from the lane. The building is flush to existing buildings at the east and west property lines.

# Development Permit for the Form and Character of Development

This project has been designed to address the Development Permit Guidelines for the Form and Character of Commercial and Mixed-Use Buildings and the Marine Drive Design Guidelines. The guidelines have been met and the project incorporates the following features:

- a flat roof with the exception of the raised feature roof sections;
- an expanded setback on Marine Drive creating an improved pedestrian realm;
- off-street parking located to the rear of the building;
- private outdoor space for each unit in the form of decks or balconies;
- a courtyard and breezeway which breaks up the length of the front façade of the building and creates a connection between Marine Drive and the rear lane;

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- an architectural treatment on the exposed west and east end walls to address the
  existing building to the east and future new development to the west;
- stone cladding and metal building materials that complement the design of the existing building to the east;
- weather protection integrated into the design of the building over the commercial storefronts;



# a) Landscaping:


The landscaping proposal incorporates street trees on both the Marine Drive and lane frontages of the site. Planting along the lane screens the exterior visitor and commercial parking level and softens the view from both the units above and from future development across the lane.

On Marine Drive patterned paving leads into the breezeway and entry to the lobby. Benches and greenery will be located throughout the breezeway leading to the rear lane with evergreens, vines and low growing hedges to create a green edge.

Additional landscaping is proposed both through the breezeway and around the outdoor common area located on the second level.

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# b) Adaptable Design:

In accordance with the Adaptable Housing Policy in effect at the time this application was made, the proposal will include 80% Level 1B units to accommodate aging in place and 20% Level 2 units.

With the recent approval of the new Accessible Design Guidelines, this in-stream application will have the choice to work with the new guidelines or meet the previous requirements and staff will work with the applicant to ensure that opportunities for meeting the objectives of the new guidelines are considered. Development Permit 17.14 requires a plan to be submitted identifying the proposed adaptable units prior to issuance of a Building Permit.

# c) Acoustic Performance:

Development Permit 17.14 requires that an acoustic report prepared by a qualified professional be provided with the Building Permit application to confirm that the building design meets or exceeds the acoustic performance standards specified in the C9 Zone.

# **Proposed Zoning Variances:**

While generally in conformance with the existing Marine Drive Commercial – C9 Zoning, the proposal includes the variances outlined below.

Variance for Parking: This project is proposing 78 parking spaces as follows: 64 residential spaces (including 6 visitor spaces) and 14 commercial spaces. The proposed residential parking is provided at a ratio of 1.56 stalls per unit (inclusive of visitor parking) which is well in excess of the 1.1 stalls supported by the District's "Reduced Parking Rates for Multi-family Residential Developments" policy for frequent transit areas and also exceeds the ratio of 1.19 stalls per unit observed in the Metro Vancouver apartment parking study.

The project proposes that the 6 residential visitor spaces and the 14 commercial spaces (provided in full compliance with the zoning bylaw requirement) be made available for shared use.

The applicant is proposing a variance of 6 stalls for the residential and visitor parking component of the project. This variance has been reviewed by the applicant's transportation engineer who has determined that the parking supply will be sufficient for the residential uses included in the project.



To accommodate the shared parking component of the project the commercial and visitor spaces will be located together in the publicly-accessible grade-level parking.

DP 17.14 requires that a final Transportation Demand Management (TDM) plan be covenanted on title. The TDM plan will be based on both the measures outlined in the parking report for the project and the requirements of the District's parking policy. This covenant will be registered prior to issuance of a Building Permit to ensure that the TDM plan is implemented prior to any occupancy of the building and to ensure that the provisions of the strategy are maintained over the long term by a future strata council.



## Bicycle Parking:

A total of 78 resident bicycle parking spaces are provided as follows: two separate bike rooms on the ground floor with 68 stackable spaces and 10 conventional spaces. An additional 6 bicycle spaces are provided for commercial patrons. In support of the parking variance, DP 17.14 secures the installation of the secured bike parking.

# Variance for Building Height:

A height variance of 1.5m (4.95ft) is necessary to accommodate the proposal for a partial parapet in the building roof design. A relatively high water table has prevented the applicant from putting the building further into the ground while still allowing one level of underground parking.

The site slopes from north to south towards the lane which results in an actual building height of 13.26m (43.5 ft) (exclusive of the partial parapet feature) along Marine Drive, which would be compliant with the maximum permitted height in the C9 zone. In addition, the building is stepped back on both the Marine Drive and rear (lane) elevations minimizing the apparent impact of increased building height.

Staff believe the height variance is supportable as the partial roof parapet adds articulation to the building design and the impact of any increased height will be minimized both by the slope of the site and the stepping back of the building along the Marine Drive.

# Variance for Building Coverage:

In order to accommodate a building design with only one level of underground parking the applicant has proposed a second level of partially covered grade-level parking for the shared use of visitors and commercial parking. This second level of parking off the rear lane has resulted in a slight increase to permitted building coverage from 85% to 86%.

Staff are supportive of the proposed variance to building coverage as the increase is minimal and will allow for a more efficient parking configuration.

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# <u>Development Permit For Energy/Water Conservation & Greenhouse Gas Emission</u> Reduction:

In accordance with the Energy and Water Conservation and Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction Guidelines, the project:

- is oriented to take advantage of solar principles;
- the outdoor common amenity space and breezeway through the building will provide for shading and natural cooling throughout the building;
- solar sunshades will be part of the design on the southern facing residential units to provide cooling during the summer months;
- incorporates durable building materials selected to minimize heat and cooling;
- includes high efficiency double glazed windows throughout the project;
- utilizes low VOC paints and finishes, and low emitting carpets and flooring;
- specifies plantings that will be drought tolerant and maintained by a high efficiency irrigation system.

These guidelines are incorporated in the Development Permit to ensure they are implemented.

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There is another proposal on the same block directly across the lane to the south of this proposal (1616 Lloyd Ave), and if necessary the two development teams will share information and strategies in terms of construction management and upgrades to the rear lane to ensure co-ordination. At this time it is unlikely that construction will be taking place during the same time period. As a condition of Development Permit 17.14, a detailed construction traffic management mitigation strategy will be required for acceptance by the District prior to the issuance of any building permit.

# This plan must address:

- 1. Construction schedule
- Coordination with other projects in the area or those affecting the transportation network
- Construction site access and egress
- 4. Estimated traffic generated by the site during construction
- 5. Proposed truck routing and staging plan
- 6. Proposed crane assembly and/or concrete pouring sites
- How traffic of all types (vehicle, transit, cyclists, pedestrians) will be managed around the site
- 8. A plan for monitoring and minimizing impacts to the community
- 9. Location of an off-street area for parking worker/trades vehicles
- 10. A plan for communicating with neighbours and other stakeholders

The requirements for issuance of a Highway Use Permit(s) must be met prior to Building Permit issuance in order to minimize construction impacts including any disruption to pedestrian or vehicular movements. Because this site is located mid-block along a major arterial route, there will be strict limitations on lane closures and these restrictions may have an impact on the construction schedule.

#### CONCURRENCE:

## Staff

The project has been reviewed by staff from Environment, Permits, Parks, Engineering, Policy Planning, Urban Design, Transportation Planning, and the Fire Department.

## Advisory Design Panel:

The application was considered by the Advisory Design Panel on June 12, 2014 and the Panel supported the application subject to improvements in accessibility through the breezeway, the additions of solar control panels along the south elevation, a review of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) issues for the commercial parking area adjacent to lane, and a review of the functionality of the waste and recycling areas for access and pick-up. These items have now been resolved to the satisfaction of staff.

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## FINANCIAL IMPACTS

This project will contribute District Development Cost Charges estimated at approximately \$295,350 to be confirmed at the Building Permit stage.

#### PUBLIC INPUT:

A facilitated public information meeting was held on June 25, 2014 and was attended by 6 people. Input received related to:

- Support for the setback of the units from Marine Drive and mid-block courtyard breezeway;
- Concern about the requested height variance;
- Concern about the amount of lot coverage;
- Maximize rain cover along Marine Drive;
- Concern about the requested parking variance;
- The need for a Crime through Environmental Design Study for the parking area at the rear of the site.

The Facilitator's report of the meeting is attached as "Attachment B".

#### Marine Drive Market and OCP Direction

In response to a request from Council an informal analysis of post occupancy surveys of purchasers in recent developments along Marine Drive shows the following trends:

Age of Purchasers – Housing the Missing Generation: A mix of ages are interested in condominium units on Marine Drive, up to 40% were under 30 in the "District Crossing" project and up to 75% were under 40 in the two Onni developments.

About 10% of purchasers are seniors downsizing and wanting one level units in the neighbourhood.

**Primary Residence:** The majority of units are being sold to people who are using them as their primary residence – 72% in "District Crossing", 100% in "The Ivy" and 75% in the two Onni developments. The remaining units will likely either be rented or used as a secondary residence.

**First Time Buyers:** For many purchasers this is the first home – 56% first time buyers in "District Crossing", 100% in "The Ivy", and 65% in the two Onni developments.

**Selling to North Shore Residents:** For all three developers the biggest group of purchasers listed themselves as being North Shore residents. In some cases these were people moving back to the North Shore.

### CONCLUSION:

This proposed development is in keeping with the building form envisioned in the OCP and permitted under the Marine Drive Commercial (C9) Zone. The project responds positively to the policy directions in the OCP for the provision of a variety of housing unit sizes including a range of studio, 1,2, and 3 bedroom units and addresses the applicable Development Permit Area design guidelines. Therefore, Development Permit 17.14 is ready for Council's consideration and staff recommend issuance.

No. BC0972146 to allow for the construction of a mixed commercial/residential project containing 41apartment units at 1041-1069 Marine Drive, on the land legally described as:

Parcel J, Block 55, District Lot 552, Group 1, New Westminster District Plan LMP37846 (PID: 024-150-886),

subject to the following terms and conditions:


- A. The following Zoning Bylaw regulations are varied under Section 920(2)(a) of the Local Government Act:
  - The maximum permitted building height is increased from 13.5m (44.3 ft) to 15m (49.25ft) and;
  - The maximum permitted building coverage is increased from 85% to 86%; and;
  - 3. The total residential/visitor parking requirement is reduced by 6 spaces from 70 to 64 spaces.
- B. The following requirements are hereby imposed under subsections 920(2)(c) of the Local Government Act:
  - Substantial construction shall commence within two years of the date of this permit, as determined by the Manager of Permits and Licenses, or the permit shall lapse.
  - An accepted Construction Management Plan is required prior to issuance
    of the Building Permit or any Excavation Permit, and may require
    amendments during the course of construction to ensure that construction
    impacts are minimized.
- C. The following requirements are hereby imposed under subsections 920(1); 920(2), (8), (9,) (10.1), (10.2), 920 (2) (c) ; of the *Local Government Act*:
  - 1. The site shall be developed in accordance with the attached site, building and landscaping plans (Appendices 17.14A 17.14T)
  - 2. Prior to issuance of a Building Permit for the construction of the proposed building, the following shall be submitted to:

- (a) Sustainability, Planning and Building Services:
  - (i) a finalized landscape plan package approved by the General Manager, Planning, Properties & Permits which amends the plans attached to this Permit;
  - (ii) a written landscape cost estimate for the installation of all landscaping as shown on the final approved landscape plan submitted by the Landscape Architect, for the acceptance of the General Manager, Planning, Properties & Permits:
  - (iii) a completed "Permission to Enter" agreement to provide evidence that a Landscape Architect has been retained to supervise the installation of the landscape works and the written authorization for the District or its agents to enter the premises and expend any or all of the deposit monies to complete the landscape works in accordance with the approved landscape plan;
  - (iv) a report from a qualified acoustic consultant confirming that the building is designed to meet the acoustic regulations in the C9 Zone;
  - (v) written confirmation that the Energy and Water Conservation and Greenhouse Emission Reduction measures as outlined in the E3 Eco Group report dated September 8, 2014 are incorporated in the Building Permit submission;
  - (vi) a plan to identify the 80% (Level1B) and 20% (Level 2) units to be constructed as adaptable units or other provision acceptable to the General Manager of Planning, and written confirmation that the units will meet the accessibility requirements;
  - (vii) Confirmation of registration of a Section 219 covenant to secure the implementation of a Travel Demand Management Plan (TDM), as outlined in the District Policy <u>Reduced</u> <u>Parking Rates for Multi-Family Residential Developments</u> and in the Traffic Engineering study prepared by MMM Group, dated November 18, 2014, all to the satisfaction of the General Manager of Engineering;
  - (viii) Confirmation of registration of a Section 219 covenant for the purpose of stipulating that all 6 residential visitor parking spaces and 14 at-grade commercial parking spaces will be pooled and available for public use and none will be designated as limited common property or otherwise assigned to specific strata lots, premises or businesses; and


- (ix) Confirmation that 58 "class 2" bicycle parking spaces have been provided of which 48 are stackable in one or more secure bicycle rooms.
- (b) Engineering, Parks and Facilities:
  - (i) Finalized civil and electrical engineering plans designed by a professional engineer for the acceptance of the General Manager, Engineering, Parks and Facilities;
  - (ii) An executed Engineering Services Agreement between the property owner and District for the acceptance of the General Manager, Engineering, Parks and Facilities; and
  - (iii) a security deposit as specified in the Engineering Services Agreement.
- D. The following requirements are hereby imposed under subsections 925(1) & (2) of the Local Government Act:
  - 1. A security deposit equal to the greater of 125% of the estimated cost of all on-site landscaping, in accordance with the approved cost estimate, or 10% of the construction value accepted on the building permit application. The deposit must be provided prior to issuance of a building permit for the proposed development on the Land and will be held as security for landscaping, building and environmental works.
  - An engineering security deposit in an amount specified in the engineering Service Agreement, to cover the construction and installation of all off-site engineering and landscaping requirements.

#### Overview:

The Public Information Meeting was designed to provide several methods for the public to engage in the process. The meeting was planned to include an Open House, where participants could browse display boards and have informal discussion with the project team; a presentation by the project team; and a facilitated dialogue session, providing the public w ith an opportunity to ask questions and comment on the proposal.

Due to the number of people who attended the event, the project team pragmatically decided to use the Open House format for the evening. The facilitator recorded public comments and questions made during the Open House on a flip chart to document the evening.

#### **Public Dialogue:**

(Q = Question, A = Answer, C=Comment, and the number is to track the dialogue)

- Q1 Why build residential units above ground-level retail here?
- A1 The site is zoned Marine Drive Commercial C-9. The intent of the C-9 zone is to accommodate mixed-use commercial and residential development. The zone requires that properties fronting Marine Drive locate residential units on the upper floors.
- Q2 Where do over-height residential vehicles park?
- A2 The underground par kade is not designed to accommodate over-height vehicles. Underground over-height vehicle parking is very expensive to provide, especially given the limits to building height and the geology of the site. Minimum underground garage height is regulated by the Building Code.
- Q3 Why are the third and fourth floors not set back from the street, as per the Marine Drive guidelines?
- A3 The upper floors are set back. Kathleen Larsen said she would confirm whether the proposal is consistent with the Marine Drive guidelines.
- C4 I'm glad the site is redeveloping.
- C5 Traffic is heavy on Marine Drive.
- C6 Consider doing a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design study for the lane south of the site.

Q7 How will you minimize impacts on adjacent buildings' walls?

A7 We will pay very close attention to the relationship with adjacent buildings, especially given the soils and drainage conditions on site.

#### Comment Sheet and Email Summary

No comment sheets were submitted at the meeting or after the meeting. One email comment was submitted to the DNV after the meeting. A copy of the email is attached as an Appendix to this report: email addresses and last names have been redacted for compliance with the DNV's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy practices.

Below is a summary of the key themes communicated by the email submitted after the meeting.

#### <u>Architecture</u>

- Support for the mid-block walk-way and internal courty ard
- · Support for setting back the residential units from Marine Drive
- Concern about the requested height variance
- Concern about the amount of lot coverage
- Maximize rain cover along Marine Drive to enhance the pedestrian environment

#### Parking

Concern about the requested parking variance

#### Conclusion

The purpose of this public meeting was to present to neighbours the proposed development concept, and provide an oppor tunity for neighbours to ask clarifying questions and comment on the proposal. Six people signed in and participated in the meeting. Due to the number of participants, the Open House format was extended to include the whole evening, to allow for informal discussion between participants and the project team.

The key themes raised at the meeting included support for development of the site, setbacks on the upper floors, parking for over-height vehicles, and crime prevention through environmental design for the rear of the building. The applicants appear to have met the Public Information Meeting requirements for their development application.



### Appendix C: Emailed Comments

Hi Kathleen,

I've reviewed the materials (which were very helpful) and have the following comments.

The mid-block walkway and internal courtyard is a welcome feature and in line with what we hoped to see along Marine. This should be coordinated with other developments and/or laneway changes to make the connection from Marine to Churchill a safe and useful one.

Setting back the residential from the first floor commercial along Marine is also a good idea as it should help reduce the shadowing of Marine a bit, particularly in winter. However, I'm concerned that this may be more than offset by the requested height variance. We already have issues with excessive shadowing in winter from new developments that were granted height variances. In the Marine Drive Improvement Strategy, the variation in roofline (for variety and architectural interest) was supposed to come from lowering some parts of the roofline below the maximum allowed (i.e., a mix of 2, 3 and 4 storeys) not exceeding the maximum height.

The site coverage is a concern. In a mixed use neighbourhood where most of the floor space is residential there should be some space around buildings.

The allowed 85% coverage is already very generous and should not be exceeded.

Parking variances continue to be a concern. In this case it's almost 25% below the District's standard. How does the proposed parking fit with what I understand is an upcoming proposal from staff for new parking policies?


The concerns about conditions for constructing underground parking may be unnecessary. Word on the street is that the redeveloped Avalon right next door was able to put in their underground parking much easier than they had anticipated.


Rain cover along Marine should be maximized to provide an enhanced pedestrian environment.

The proposed townhouse project requires Council's consideration of Bylaw 8113 to rezone the subject properties. Bylaw 8114 implements the District's Strata Rental Protection Policy for the proposed project to ensure the units retain the option to be rented.

# SUMMARY:

Noort Developments Ltd. seeks rezoning of two single family properties to allow an 18 unit stacked townhouse project at 115 and 123 West Queens Road. The proposal complies with the Official Community Plan (OCP) designation and the bylaws supporting the project are recommended for introduction and referral to Public Hearing.

### ANALYSIS:

### Site and Surrounding Area:

The development site is currently two detached residential properties on the south side of West Queens Road just west of Lonsdale Avenue. The Queens Cross Pub is located directly east of the site and 'Churchill Retirement Residences' is located south and west of the site. A gas station is located northeast of the site and single family homes are located to the north and northwest of the site. The site is currently zoned Single-Family Residential 6000 (RS4).






### **EXISTING POLICY:**

### Official Community Plan (OCP)

The site is designated Residential Level 5: "Low Density Apartment" (RES5) in the OCP. Areas designated for low density apartment are intended predominantly for multifamily housing in centres and corridors at a density of up to approximately 1.75 FSR. Development in this designation will typically be expressed in low-rise apartments, but may include some townhouses.

Properties to the west have the same OCP designation as the development site while those along

Lonsdale Avenue are designated Commercial Residential Mixed Use Level One (CRMU1) which allows mixed-use development to a maximum density of up to approximately 1.75 FSR.

The development site is within the Queensdale "Village Centre" – One of the six designated village centres throughout the District. Generally, the OCP designations near the core of village centres (as is the case for Queensdale) support increased multi-family and mixed use densities in order to take advantage of transit options, access to services, and walkability. The objective for each village centre is to build on their own unique characteristics and to create distinct urban village environments.

The proposed FSR for the development at approximately 1.68 F.S.R. is consistent with the OCP designation for the site.

# North Lonsdale Delbrook Official Community Plan

The policies and objectives in the OCP considered the general directions from the North Lonsdale Delbrook Official Community Plan (1995) and the previous plan remains as a guidance document in consideration of new development.

The North Lonsdale Delbrook Plan designated the south side of West Queens Road (100 block) for seniors and 'empty nesters' housing at a maximum density of 36.3 units per acre (90 units/hectare). The development proposal under consideration proposes market housing with no preference given to seniors or 'empty nesters'. The following seniors housing is currently available in the immediate vicinity:

- 188 West 29<sup>th</sup> Street: "Vista 29" A 50 unit condominium development which has a 55+ occupancy restriction.
- 150 West 29<sup>th</sup> Street: "Churchill Retirement Residence" A 97 unit rental development providing assisted living for seniors.

#### Zoning

The site is currently zoned Single-Family Residential 6000 (RS4). To accommodate the proposed stacked townhouse development the site requires rezoning; accordingly, Bylaw 8113 (Attachment A) proposes to create a new Comprehensive Development Zone 89 (CD89).

### Strata Rental Protection Policy

Corporate Policy 8-3300-2 "Strata Rental Protection Policy" applies to this project as the rezoning application would permit development of more than five residential units. The policy requires a Housing Agreement to ensure that future strata bylaws do not prevent owners from renting their units. Bylaw 8114 (Attachment B) authorizing a Housing Agreement to implement this policy.

### **Development Permit Areas**

The development site is designated as Development Permit Areas for the following purposes:

- Form and Character of Multi-Family Development (Multi-Family Housing); and
- Energy and Water Conservation and Greenhouse Gas Emission Reductions.


A detailed development permit report, outlining the project's compliance with the applicable DPA guidelines will be provided for Council's consideration at the Development Permit stage should the rezoning proceed.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The development includes 18 stacked townhouse units in two separate buildings arranged around a central courtyard. As proposed, three units will have direct front door access to West

Queens Road while the remaining 15 units will be accessed from the courtyard. The adjacent site plan indicates the general siting of the proposed buildings.

The application requires purchase of a portion of municipal lane located south of the development site and the lane closure bylaw has been considered by Council. The secured parking area, beneath the development, will be accessed from the rear of the site via the existing lane.



A mix of two and three bedroom units is proposed within the development: 5 two bedroom units and 13 three bedroom units. The drawing below illustrates the proposal as viewed from West Queens Road and the appearance of the development from the street. Given the slope onsite (which slopes from a higher elevation on West Queens Road), the development's northerly building appears as a three storey development when viewed from West Queens Road.



Thirty-two parking stalls are provided for the development in an underground parking garage; 3 of the stalls are designated visitor spaces. Parking proposed for the development is reduced by four stalls relative to standard zoning bylaw requirements; however, a professional parking reduction analysis was provided which supports the reduced parking (to a ratio of approximately 1.78 stalls per unit inclusive of visitor parking). Transit services nearby within the Lonsdale corridor and nearby access to goods and services within the Queensdale Village Centre help to support the proposed small reduction in parking requirements.

The development will provide:

- 29 Bicycle stalls (24 secure for residents & 5 for visitors located in courtyard);
- 32 Parking stalls (29 for residents & 3 for visitors);
- 10 Tandem parking stalls (31% of total parking);
- 11 Small Car parking stalls (34% of total parking);
- 1 Universally accessible parking stall.

The development includes a sloped-roof design that provides some variety in design compared to the flat roof design seen in the existing Churchill Residences building to the west and to reflect the sloped roof designs seen in the single family homes northwest of the site and the Queens Cross Pub to the east.

### Accessible Units

In response to the District's "Accessible Design Policy for Multi-Family Housing", the development incorporates two accessible units (which front directly onto West Queens Road) which can be retrofitted to provide enhanced accessible design elements in accordance with District policy. Among other adaptations, these two units could be provided stair lifts to access the parking garage. As required within the accessible design policy, there are certain basic accessible design elements that must be incorporated into the design for each unit (where feasible). At the development permit stage, the developer will be required to submit an "Accessible Multi-Family Housing Design Checklist" which identifies how the entire development attains the requirements of the policy.

### **REZONING BYLAW 8113**

To implement this project, Bylaw 8113 (Attachment A) creates a new Comprehensive Development Zone 89 (CD89). This new zone:

- establishes ground-oriented multiple family residential use as a permitted use;
- limits the number of units to 18;
- limits the FSR to a maximum of 1.70;
- establishes a maximum building height of 45 ft with a small height bonus to accommodate the sloped roofs
- sets site coverage at a maximum of 90%
- · sets building coverage at a maximum of 57%;
- · establishes acoustic performance requirements;
- requires a parking ratio of approximately 1.78 stalls per unit

- establishes a minimum drive aisle width of at least 6m (20 ft); and
- generally establishes the following building setbacks
  - Front Setback: 3.56 metres
  - West Side Yard Setback: 3.75 metres
  - East Side Yard Setback: 2.59 metres
  - Rear Yard Setback 3.35 metres
  - Setback from Lane: 0 metres

#### ACOUSTIC REGULATIONS

The CD89 zone includes the District's residential acoustic regulations for maximum noise levels in bedrooms, living areas and other areas of the residential units where units front an arterial roadway. The application will be required to meet these requirements.

# COMMUNITY AMENITY CONTRIBUTIONS (CACS)

As the subject property requires rezoning, the applicant will be contributing \$5 per square foot for increased residential floor area in accordance with the District's Community Amenity Policy. An amount of \$106,485 is applicable for payment at the building permit stage and the CD89 zone specifies this amount in order to achieve the maximum density of 1.7 FSR in the zone.

#### **PUBLIC ART**


The applicant has submitted a letter of intent indicating their commitment to provide public art for this project. Funds to provide public art are anticipated to be approximately 0.5% of the estimated cost of construction and form part of the Community Amenity Contribution.

The applicant will work with the Public Art Coordinator and North Vancouver Public Art Advisory Committee to establish a plan prior to consideration of a Development Permit.

### VEHICLE ACCESS:


The adjacent map indicates the existing traffic movements in the local area with site access locations shown by green arrows. There is an existing barrier within the lane just south of the Queens Cross Pub that stops movements westward from Lonsdale Avenue. This barrier allows entrance into the Queen Cross Pub underground parking and the parking lot for the commercial site at 2945-2953 Lonsdale Avenue.

Transportation Planning supports the proposed reduced parking and provision of vehicle access to the project via the existing lane in order to reduce vehicle access to West Queens Road. The traffic



movements within the lane to the rear of the site will remain in order to decrease use of the east/west lane for access to Lonsdale Avenue.

The site plan below indicates the proposed traffic movements within the lanes at the rear the proposed development.



#### CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN:

In order to reduce development's impact on pedestrian and vehicular movements, the developer will be required to provide a 'Construction Traffic Management Plan' as a condition of a Development Permit. The Construction Traffic Management Plan must minimize construction impacts on pedestrian movement and vehicular traffic along West Queens Road and within the lanes behind the development site. The plan is required to be approved by the District prior to issuance of a Building Permit.

In particular, the 'Construction Traffic Management Plan' must:

- Limit sidewalk closures to those necessary for sidewalk upgrades along West Queens Road and include measures to reduce any impacts to traffic and pedestrians;
- 2. Outline roadway efficiencies (i.e. location of traffic management signs and flaggers);
- 3. Provide a point of contact for all calls and concerns;
- 4. Provide a sequence and schedule of construction activities;
- 5. Identify methods of sharing construction schedule with other developments in the area:
- Define locations for truck marshalling and trade vehicle parking which are acceptable to the District and minimize impacts to neighbourhoods; and
- 7. Include a communication plan to notify surrounding businesses and residents.

There are no other impending rezoning or development permit projects within the Queensdale Village Centre that are slated for consideration by Council.

# Advisory Design Panel:

The proposal was presented to the Advisory Design Panel on December 11, 2014. The Panel recommended approval subject to staff resolution of material use and location, finishes and simplification of design.

The applicant revised the proposal to address ADP recommendations and the proposal has been modified appropriately to the satisfaction of staff. The applicant's architect provided a scale model which will be available for Council's review.

#### CONCURRENCE:

### Staff:

The project has been reviewed by Building, Parks, Engineering and Transportation, Urban Design Planning, Real Estate and Properties, and Fire Prevention staff. Staff has made recommendations, throughout the development process, to improve the development and to address specific concerns to the satisfaction of staff.

### Public Input:

In accordance with Council's Policy, the applicant held a facilitated Public Information Meeting on November 27, 2014 at 2641 Chesterfield Avenue (St. Andrew's and St. Stephen's Presbyterian Church). The applicant provided notices to owners and occupants within 75 metres of the development site (multiple notices were provided to the building manager of Churchill Retirement Residence for circulation within common areas and elevator). The meeting was attended by five people and an excerpt from the facilitator's summary is attached (Attachment C).

#### CONCLUSION:

This rezoning proposal for 18 townhouses is in conformity with the Official Community Plan and applicable development permit guidelines. Bylaws 8113 and 8114 are ready for Council consideration.

### OPTIONS:

The following options are available for Council's consideration:

- 1. Introduce Bylaws 8113 and 8114 and refer Bylaw 8113 to a Public Hearing (staff recommendation); or
- Defeat Bylaws 8113 and 8114 at First Reading.

# **Bylaw 8113**

A bylaw to amend the District of North Vancouver Zoning Bylaw 3210, 1965

The Council for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver enacts as follows:

### 1. Citation

This bylaw may be cited as "The District of North Vancouver Rezoning Bylaw 1327, (Bylaw 8113)".

# 2. Amendments

- 2.1 The District of North Vancouver Zoning Bylaw 3210, 1965 is amended as follows:
  - 2.1.1 Section 301(2) by inserting the following zoning designation:

"Comprehensive Development Zone CD89"

2.1.2 Part 4B by inserting the following:

"4B89 Comprehensive Development Zone 89 (CD89)

### 4B89-1 Intent:

The purpose of the CD-89 zone is to permit development of an 18 unit townhouse development at 115 and 123 West Queens Road.

### 4B89-2 Uses:

The following *principal uses* shall be permitted in the Comprehensive Development 89 Zone:

### (a) Uses Permitted without Conditions:

(i) Ground-oriented stacked townhouse residential use

# (b) Conditional Uses

Not applicable

# 4B89-3 Conditions of Use:

Not applicable.

### 4B89-4 Accessory Use:

- (a) Accessory uses are permitted and are limited to:
  - (i) Home occupations in accordance with the regulations in Section 405 of the Zoning Bylaw, 1965.

# 4B89-5 Density:

- (a) The maximum permitted density in the CD89 Zone is limited to a floor space ratio (FSR) of 0.45, inclusive of any density bonus for energy performance;
- (b) For the purposes of calculating floor space ratio, the area of parking garages, electrical/mechanical rooms, garbage and recycling collection areas, and bicycle storage areas, is exempted.

### 4B89-6 Amenities:

Despite subsection 4B89-5, density in the CD89 Zone is increased to a maximum floor space ratio of 1.70 FSR, inclusive of any density bonus for energy performance, if the owner:

- Enters into a Housing Agreement requiring a rental disclosure statement to be filed and prohibiting any strata bylaw or regulation establishing rental restrictions; and
- Contributes \$106,485 to the municipality to be used for any or all of the following amenities (with allocation to be determined by the municipality in its sole discretion): public art; park, trail, environmental or other public realm improvements; municipal or recreation service or facility improvements; and/or the affordable housing fund.

Not applicable.

  - 2.1.3 The Zoning Map is amended in the case of the lands in Schedule A, by rezoning the land outlined and noted as "site" from Residential Single Family Residential 6000 Zone (RS-4) to Comprehensive Development 89 Zone (CD89).

**DEFINITIONS** 

In this agreement:

Definitions

- "Development Permit" means development permit No. \_\_\_\_\_ issued by the District;
- (b) "Lands" means land described in Item 2 of the Land Title Act Form C to which this agreement is attached;
- (c) "Proposed Development" means the proposed development containing not more than 18 Units to be constructed on the Lands in accordance with the Development Permit;
- (d) "Unit" means a residential dwelling strata unit in the Proposed Development; and
- (e) "Unit Owner" means the registered owner of a Dwelling Unit in the Proposed Development.

# 2. <u>TERM</u>

This Agreement will commence upon adoption by District Council of Bylaw 8114 and remain in effect until terminated by the District as set out in this Agreement.

# 3. RENTAL ACCOMODATION

### 3.01 Rental Disclosure Statement

No Unit in the Proposed Development may be occupied unless the Owner has:

- (a) before the first Unit is offered for sale, or conveyed to a purchaser without being offered for sale, filed with the Superintendent of Real Estate a Rental Disclosure Statement designating all of the Units as rental strata lots and imposing a ninetynine (99) year rental period in relation to all of the Units pursuant to the Strata Property Act (or any successor or replacement legislation); and
- (b) given a copy of the Rental Disclosure Statement to each prospective purchaser of any Unit before the prospective purchaser enters into an agreement to purchase in respect of the Unit.

### 3.02 Rental Accommodation

The Units constructed on the Lands from time to time may always be used to provide rental accommodation as the Owner or a Unit Owner may choose from time to time.

### 3.03 Binding on Strata Corporation

This agreement shall be binding upon all strata corporations created by the subdivision of the Lands or any part thereof (including the Units) pursuant to the *Strata Property Act*, and upon all Unit Owners. .

### 3.04 Strata Bylaw Invalid

Any strata Ccorporation bylaw which prevents, restricts or abridges the right to use any of the Units as rental accommodations shall have no force or effect.

# 3.05 No Bylaw

The strata corporation shall not pass any bylaws preventing, restricting or abridging the use of the Lands, the Proposed Development or the Units contained therein from time to time as rental accommodation.

### 3.06 Vote

No Unit Owner, nor any tenant or mortgagee thereof, shall vote for any strata corporation bylaw purporting to prevent, restrict or abridge the use of the Lands, the Proposed Development and the units contained therein from time to time as rental accommodation.

### 3.07 Notice

The Owner will provide notice of this Agreement to any person or persons intending to purchase a Unit prior to any such person entering into an agreement of purchase and sale, agreement for sale, or option or similar right to purchase as part of the Disclosure Statement for any part of the Proposed Development prepared by the Owner pursuant to the *Real Estate Development Marketing Act*.

# 4. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

### 4.01 Notice of Default

The District may, acting reasonably, give to the Owner written notice to cure a default under this Agreement within thirty (30) days of delivery of the notice. The notice must specify the nature of the default. The Owner must act with diligence to correct the default within the time specified.

### 4.02 Costs

The Owner will pay to the District upon demand all the District's costs of exercising its rights or remedies under this Agreement, on a full indemnity basis.

### 4.03 Damages an Inadequate Remedy

The Owner acknowledges and agrees that in the case of a breach of this Agreement which is not fully remediable by the mere payment of money and promptly so remedied, the harm sustained by the District and to the public interest will be irreparable and not susceptible of adequate monetary compensation.

### 4.04 Equitable Remedies

Each party to this Agreement, in addition to its rights under this Agreement or at law, will be entitled to all equitable remedies including specific performance, injunction and declaratory relief, or any of them, to enforce its rights under this Agreement.

# 4.05 No Penalty or Forfeiture

The Owner acknowledges and agrees that it is entering into this Agreement to benefit the public interest in providing rental accommodation, and that the District's rights and

remedies under this Agreement are necessary to ensure that this purpose is carried out, and the District's rights and remedies under this Agreement are fair and reasonable and ought not to be construed as a penalty or forfeiture.

### 4.06 Cumulative Remedies

No reference to nor exercise of any specific right or remedy under this Agreement or at law or at equity by any party will prejudice, limit or preclude that party from exercising any other right or remedy. No right or remedy will be exclusive or dependent upon any other right to remedy, but any party, from time to time, may exercise any one or more of such rights or remedies independently, successively, or in combination. The Owner acknowledges that specific performance, injunctive relief (mandatory or otherwise) or other equitable relief may be the only adequate remedy for a default by the Owner under this Agreement.

# 5. LIABILITY

# 5.01 Indemnity

Except if arising directly from the negligence of the District or its employees, agents or contractors, the Owner will indemnify and save harmless each of the District and its board members, officers, directors, employees, agents, and elected or appointed officials,, and their heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, successors and assigns, from and against all claims, demands, actions, loss, damage, costs and liabilities that all or any of them will or may be liable for or suffer or incur or be put to any act or omission by the Owner or its officers, directors, employees, agents, contractors, or other persons for whom the Owner is at law responsible, or by reason of or arising out of the Owner's ownership, operation, management or financing of the Proposed Development or any part thereof.

### 5.02 Release

The Owner hereby releases and forever discharges the District, its elected officials, board members, officers, directors, employees and agents, and its and their heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, successors and assigns from and against all claims, demands, damages, actions or causes of action by reason of or arising out of advice or direction respecting the ownership, operation or management of the Proposed Development or any part thereof which has been or hereafter may be given to the Owner by all or any of them.

### 5.03 Survival

The covenants of the Owner set out in Sections 5.01 and 5.02 will survive termination of this Agreement and continue to apply to any breach of the Agreement or claim arising under this Agreement during the ownership by the Owner of the Lands or any Unit therein, as applicable.

### 6. GENERAL PROVISIONS

### 6.01 District's Power Unaffected

# Nothing in this Agreement:

- affects or limits any discretion, rights, powers, duties or obligations of the District under any enactment or at common law, including in relation to the use or subdivision of land;
- affects or limits any enactment relating to the use of the Lands or any condition contained in any approval including any development permit concerning the development of the Lands; or
- (c) relieves the Owner from complying with any enactment, including the District's bylaws in relation to the use of the Lands.

# 6.02 Agreement for Benefit of District Only

The Owner and District agree that:

- (a) this Agreement is entered into only for the benefit of the District:
- (b) this Agreement is not intended to protect the interests of the Owner, any Unit Owner, any Occupant or any future owner, occupier or user of any part of the Proposed Development, including any Unit, or the interests of any third party, and the District has no obligation to anyone to enforce the terms of this Agreement; and
- (c) The District may at any time terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, and execute a release and discharge of this Agreement in respect of the Proposed Development or any Unit therein, without liability to anyone for doing so.

### 6.03 Agreement Runs With the Lands

This Agreement burdens and runs with the Lands and any part into which any of them may be subdivided or consolidated, by strata plan or otherwise. All of the covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement are made by the Owner for itself, its successors and assigns, and all persons who acquire an interest in the Lands or in any Unit after the date of this Agreement.

### 6.04 Release

The covenants and agreements on the part of the Owner and any Unit Owner and herein set forth in this Agreement have been made by the Owner and any Unit Owner as contractual obligations as well as being made pursuant to Section 905 of the *Local Government Act* (British Columbia) and as such will be binding on the Owner and any Unit Owner, except that neither the Owner nor any Unit Owner shall be liable for any default in the performance or observance of this Agreement occurring after such party ceases to own the Lands or a Unit as the case may be.

# 6.05 Priority of This Agreement

The Owner will, at its expense, do or cause to be done all acts reasonably necessary to ensure this Agreement is registered against the title to each Unit in the Proposed

Development, including any amendments to this Agreement as may be required by the Land Title Office or the District to effect such registration.

# 6.06 Agreement to Have Effect as Deed

The District and the Owner each intend by execution and delivery of this Agreement to create both a contract and a deed under seal.

### 6.07 Waiver

An alleged waiver by a party of any breach by another party of its obligations under this Agreement will be effective only if it is an express waiver of the breach in writing. No waiver of a breach of this Agreement is deemed or construed to be a consent or waiver of any other breach of this Agreement.

### 6.08 Time

Time is of the essence in this Agreement. If any party waives this requirement, that party may reinstate it by delivering notice to another party.

### 6.09 Validity of Provisions

If a Court of competent jurisdiction finds that any part of this Agreement is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, that part is to be considered to have been severed from the rest of this Agreement and the rest of this Agreement remains in force unaffected by that holding or by the severance of that part.

# 6.10 Extent of Obligations and Costs

Every obligation of a party which is set out in this Agreement will extend throughout the Term and, to the extent that any obligation ought to have been observed or performed prior to or upon the expiry or earlier termination of the Term, such obligation will survive the expiry or earlier termination of the Term until it has been observed or performed.

#### 6.11 Notices

All notices, demands, or requests of any kind, which a party may be required or permitted to serve on another in connection with this Agreement, must be in writing and may be served on the other parties by registered mail, by facsimile transmission, or by personal service, to the following address for each party:

#### If to the Unit Owner:

The address of the registered owner which appears on title to the Unit at the time of notice.

Service of any such notice, demand, or request will be deemed complete, if made by registered mail, 72 hours after the date and hour of mailing, except where there is a postal service disruption during such period, in which case service will be deemed to be complete only upon actual delivery of the notice, demand or request; if made by facsimile transmission, on the first business day after the date when the facsimile transmission was transmitted; and if made by personal service, upon personal service being effected. Any party, from time to time, by notice in writing served upon the other parties, may designate a different address or different or additional persons to which all notices, demands, or requests are to be addressed.

### 6.12 Further Assurances

Upon request by the District, the Owner will promptly do such acts and execute such documents as may be reasonably necessary, in the opinion of the District, to give effect to this Agreement.

### 6.13 Enuring Effect

This Agreement will enure to the benefit of and be binding upon each of the parties and their successors and permitted assigns.

### 7. INTERPRETATION

### 7.01 References

Gender specific terms include both genders and include corporations. Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

### 7.02 Construction

The division of this Agreement into sections and the use of headings are for convenience of reference only and are not intended to govern, limit or aid in the construction of any provision. In all cases, the language in this Agreement is to be construed simply according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against either party.

### 7.03 No Limitation

The word "including" when following any general statement or term is not to be construed to limit the general statement or term to the specific items which immediately follow the general statement or term similar items whether or not words such as "without limitation" or "but not limited to" are used, but rather the general statement or term is to

be construed to refer to all other items that could reasonably fall within the broadest possible scope of the general statement or term.

# 7.04 Terms Mandatory

The words "must" and "will" and "shall" are to be construed as imperative.

### 7.05 Statutes

Any reference in this Agreement to any statute or bylaw includes any subsequent amendment, re-enactment, or replacement of that statute or bylaw.

# 7.06 Entire Agreement

- (d) This is the entire agreement between the District and the Owner concerning its subject, and there are no warranties, representations, conditions or collateral agreements relating to this Agreement, except as included in this Agreement.
- (e) This Agreement may be amended only by a document executed by the parties to this Agreement and by bylaw, such amendment to be effective only upon adoption by District Council of a bylaw to amend Bylaw 8097.

# 7.07 Governing Law

This Agreement is to be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of British Columbia.

As evidence of their agreement to be bound by the terms of this instrument, the parties hereto have executed the *Land Title Act* Form C that is attached hereto and forms part of this Agreement.

- D. Section 207 of the *Land Title Act* permits the Prior Chargeholder to grant priority over a charge to the District as Subsequent Chargeholder.

THEREFORE this Agreement is evidence that in consideration of \$1.00 and other good and valuable consideration received by the Prior Chargeholder from the District (the receipt and sufficiency of which the Prior Chargeholder acknowledges):

- The Prior Chargeholder consents to the granting and registration of the Subsequent Charge and the Prior Chargeholder agrees that the Subsequent Charge shall be binding upon their interest in and to the Land.
- 2. The Prior Chargeholder grants to the District, as a Subsequent Chargeholder, priority for the Subsequent Charge over the Prior Chargeholder's right, title and interest in and to the Land, and the Prior Chargeholder postpones the Prior Charge and all of their right, title and interest thereunder to the Subsequent Charge as if the Subsequent Charge had been executed, delivered and registered prior to the execution, delivery and registration of the Prior Charge.

As evidence of its agreement to be bound by the terms of this instrument, the Prior Chargeholder has executed the Land Title Office Form C to which this Agreement is attached and which forms part of this Agreement.

# Summary of Public Information Meeting Held Nov. 27, 2014

The project team present at the meeting included:

- Merlin Wick, Noort Holdings Ltd.
- Taizo Yamamoto, Yamamoto Architecture Ltd.
- Lilian Arishenkoff, Community Planner, District of North Vancouver
- Brian Wallace, BWW Consulting, Traffic Consultant
- Jay Hiscox, Main Street Architecture, Meeting Facilitator

A total of 5 people signed in to the meeting and 5 comment forms were returned.

Based on the feedback received, all of the attendees had their questions answered and none appeared to have left with outstanding questions. Several visitors were supportive of the scheme as presented, and several comments were noted that felt the project would be a welcome redevelopment for this frontage of West Queens Road.

Questions fielded during the meeting included the following;

- Concern for additional traffic that could be generated along West Queens Road, especially as relates to short term visitor parking to the project, and existing overflow parking from the pub.
- Concern regarding the number of visitor parking stalls provided.
- Concern for additional dogs' impact on private green lawns across West Queens Road
- Concern for project height and setbacks relative to existing single family housing along West Queens Road.
- Concerns regarding the attendance of the meeting, questions about the most suitable time to hold such a public information meeting.
- Concern regarding speed of traffic along West Queens Road
- Specific questions regarding parking signage and permitted parking on the street frontage.
- Questions regarding project timelines, expected construction completion.
- Questions regarding building materials, noise impact of street wall of 3 storeys.
- Questions regarding materials, colours, roof shapes

# 2.4 Community Inquiries

Noort Holdings Ltd. did not receive any community inquiries via emails and phone calls regarding the project.

# 2.5 Response to Public feedback

The following changes are presently contemplated as a result of the Public Information meeting:

- Noort would consider changing 2 resident parking spaces to visitor (if recommended by DNV staff)
- Secondary projections redesigned to a shed roof to reduce street noise along W. Queens Rd.
- Large trees proposed along the boulevard to reduce street noise along W. Queens Rd.
- Noort Homes Ltd. has also agreed to promote the use of an alternative mode of transportation by offering transit passes to the residents. This will help minimize vehicle activity in the area.
