# 8.3. Unsightly Property at 1069 West 23<sup>rd</sup> Street, North Vancouver

Recommendation:

That Council resolve as follows:

 Council considers the property at 1069 West 23<sup>rd</sup> Street, legally described as PID: 012-916-145 Lot 5 of Block 4 District Lot 552 Plan 3412

Lot 5 of Block 4 District Lot 552 Plan 3412 (the "Property")

to be in a condition that is so unclean as to be offensive to the community.

Therefore, pursuant to section 74 of the *Community Charter*, Council hereby declares the Property to be a nuisance and imposes the remedial action requirements set out in section 2 below (collectively, the "Remedial Action Requirements") on Robert and Imaculata Crossley, the registered owners of the Property (together, the "Owners") in order to address and remedy the untidy condition of the property.

- 2. The Owners are required to bring the Property up to the standard of the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw within 30 days of the receipt of the notice of the order, by carrying out the following Remedial Action Requirements:
  - a. Remove and donate re-usable items or recycle any materials including, but not limited to any salvaged construction materials, windows, lumber, cut wood, appliances, tools, gutters, racking, used paint, tires, derelict vehicles and trailer or dispose of appropriately;
  - Clear the Property of any accumulations of discarded items and rubbish
    of any kind and take to the transfer station, and including but not limited
    to, lifts of deteriorated pre-engineered truss joists, cupboards, boats,
    tarps and buckets;
  - c. Cut any overgrown vegetation and take to yard waste area of the transfer station; and
  - d. In general, make the Property neat and tidy.
- 3. Council directs that the Remedial Action Requirements specified in section 2 be completed to the satisfaction of the Chief Bylaw Officer.
- 4. Council directs that in the event that the Owners fail to fully comply with the Remedial Action Requirements, the District may:
  - a. take all necessary actions to fulfill the requirements at the expense of the Owners in accordance with s.17 of the Community Charter; and,
  - b. that costs of such actions shall be treated as a debt owed to the District of North Vancouver which if unpaid at the end of this calendar year will be added to the property taxes pursuant to s. 258 of the Community Charter.
- 5. Council sets the time limit for compliance with the Remedial Action Requirements at 30 days, commencing April 19, 2013.

 Council sets the time limit for a written notice of a request for Council to reconsider the Remedial Action Requirements be set at 14 days, commencing April 19, 2013.

- The Council of the District of North Vancouver recommends that the North Shore Winter Club's extension of liquor licence hours be approved for their Banquet room and Lounge on Friday night from 1:00am to 2:00am Saturday morning, and Saturday night from 1:00am to 2:00am Sunday morning.
- 2. Council's comments on the prescribed considerations are as follows:
  - (a) The potential for noise if the application is approved.

To address the issue of noise concerns in the parking lot the applicant has hired a security guard to monitor the property in addition to an improving the level of communication with members and sports teams regarding noise and activity.

(b) The impact on the community if the application is approved.

The continued provision of additional security on the subject property will help to minimize the impact of the additional open hours on the surrounding residential neighbours. The applicant has also agreed to send a yearly letter to Club members and ensure that permanent notices are posted in the club requesting that noise level be kept to a minimum when exiting the Club.

(c) Whether the amendment may result in the establishment being operated in a manner that is contrary to its primary purpose.

The additional operating hour on Friday and Saturday nights will not change the Winter Club's primary purpose.

3. Council's comments on the views of residents are as follows:

District Council passed a resolution in June 2011 to support a 12 month trial period of the extended operating hours on Friday and Saturday nights.

As there have been no documented complaints directly attributable to the extended hours of operation in the intervening time period Council support the application for the permanent extension of the liquor licence for one hour on Friday and Saturday nights only.
