Considering that most other lots on Violet Street have already been subdivided the Blueridge Community Association finds it difficult to oppose this subdivision in principle. Why would the owner of 2646 Violet Street not be able to subdivide their lot, when nearly all their neighbours on the very same street have applied and been allowed to subdivide their lots over the last number of years.

However, we did learn from the Public Hearing held on February 17, 2015, pertaining to 2698 Violet Street that parking is a huge issue on Violet Street. This may be attributed to the fact that so many lots have been subdivided over the years, and because many properties would appear to have secondary suites. It is most definitely a fact that parking on Violet Street can be an issue at night – driving through this street in the evening will definitely confirm this.

Nobody from Violet Street has approached the Blueridge Community Association in this respect prior to tonight's Public Hearing, but we suspect – based on last year's Public Hearing on a similar subdivision on Violet Street – that Council may hear this issue raised by neighbours on Violet Street also tonight.
