



### RECOMMENDATION:

THAT "District of North Vancouver Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002 Amendment Bylaw 8473, 2020 (Amendment 5)" is given FIRST, SECOND, and THIRD Reading;

### BACKGROUND:

Staff recommend that Attachment E, the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002, Amendment Bylaw 8473, 2020, in the Report to Council dated November 10, 2020 entitled "Standards and Regulations in Single Family Zones" (the "Report"), in the November 23, 2020 Special Meeting Council agenda package be replaced by the attached (Attachment A) amending bylaw which clarifies the time of day that holiday lighting may be turned on each day at 7:00 a.m.

At the November 19, 2019, Council Workshop, Council provided direction to address concerns and/or issues raised with regards to residential standards and "target area 3" of nuisance lighting.

The amending bylaw attached to the Report proposes a time that residents must turn off their holiday display lighting overnight at 11 p.m. until the following day.

"Christmas or holiday lights between November 15 and January 15, Halloween lights between October 15 and November 7, provided such lighting is turned off by 11:00 p.m. each day and remains off overnight the following day"

For clarity, it is further proposed that the bylaw require that such lighting remain off until 7:00 a.m. the following day:

"Christmas or holiday lights between November 15 and January 15, Halloween lights between October 15 and November 7, provided such lighting is turned off by 11:00 p.m. each day and remains off overnight until 7:00 a.m. the following day"

This change will help clarify requirements and expectations and will assist with enforcement, if required. Please refer to the Report for further discussion on nuisance lighting and the preferred options identified in the Council's Workshop. The proposed amending bylaw also includes varied housekeeping changes to update definitions, fine levels and references to the *Community Charter*.

### Options:

- 1. Give District of North Vancouver Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002 Amendment Bylaw 8473, 2020 (Amendment 5) FIRST, SECOND, and THIRD Reading; or
- 2. Provide alternate direction to staff; or
- 3. Make no changes to the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw at this time.

## The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver Bylaw 8473

A bylaw to amend Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002

The Council for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver enacts as follows:

### Citation

1. This bylaw may be cited as "Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002 Amendment Bylaw 8473, 2020 (Amendment 5)".

### Amendments

- 2. Nuisance Abatement Bylaw 7325, 2002 is amended by:
  - a) deleting "section 725 of the *Local Government Act*, R.S.B.C. 1996, c323" in the Preamble and substituting "section 8 of the *Community Charter*, SBC 2003, c. 26";
  - b) deleting the definition of "Bylaw Enforcement Officer" in section 2 and substituting the following:
    - **Bylaw Enforcement Officer** means the person(s) appointed to this position by the District whose duties include enforcing and carrying out the provisions of this bylaw;
  - c) adding the following definition of "Parcel" to section 2 in alphabetical order:
    - **Parcel** means a lot, block, or other area in which land is held or into which land is subdivided, including a strata lot and a lot created under the *Strata Property Act*, SBC 1998, c. 43, as amended or replaced;
  - d) deleting the definition of "Real Property" in section 2 and substituting the following:
    - Real Property means a Parcel of land in the District;
  - e) deleting the definitions for "Order to Comply" and "Treasurer" in section 2;
  - f) deleting subsection 6(e)(i) and substituting the following:
    - (i) the owner of the property is in possession of a valid building permit in respect of such Building Materials;
  - g) deleting subsection 9(a) and substituting the following:

- (a) Christmas or holiday lights between November 15 and January 15, Halloween lights between October 15 and November 7, provided such lighting is turned off by 11:00 p.m. each day and remains off overnight until 7:00 a.m. the following day;
- h) deleting sections 10 through 22 inclusive and substituting the following and renumbering the remaining sections accordingly:

### PART X – OFFENCE AND ENFORCEMENT

### Entry

10. Bylaw Enforcement Officers and members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are authorized, in accordance with section 16 of the *Community Charter*, SBC 2003, c. 26, as amended or replaced, to enter at any reasonable time onto property to inspect and determine whether the regulations of this bylaw are being complied with.

### Obstruction

11. A person must not interfere with, delay, obstruct or impede a Bylaw Enforcement Officer or designate or other person lawfully authorized to enforce this bylaw in the performance of duties under this bylaw.

### **Violations**

12. Every person who violates any of the provisions of this bylaw or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention of this bylaw or who neglects to do or refrains from doing any act or thing which violates any of the provisions of this bylaw will be liable to the penalties hereby imposed and each day that such violation is permitted to exist will constitute a separate offence.

### **Penalty**

13. Every person who commits an offence contrary to the provisions of this bylaw is liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not more than \$50,000.00 in addition to the costs of the prosecution.

### **Designation of Bylaw**

14. This bylaw is designated under section 264 of the *Community Charter* as a bylaw that may be enforced by means of a ticket in the form prescribed.

### **Designation of Bylaw Enforcement Officer**

15. Bylaw Enforcement Officers, park rangers and members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are designated to enforce this bylaw by means of a ticket under section 264 of the *Community Charter*.

### **Ticketing**

16. Pursuant to Sections 264(1)(c) and 265(1)(a) of the *Community Charter*, the table below sets out the designated expressions for offences under this bylaw with the corresponding bylaw section number and fine amount:
