- Advocate for rapid transit routes from the District to adjacent municipalities





What to add

- Incentivize and expedite passive, zero fossil fuel projects and infill development (e.g., secondary suites)
- Promote social connectivity within residential developments
- Make deconstruction (not demolition) of buildings a requirement
- Emphasize that housing is an essential need and not a commodity
- Advocate for a diversity of unit sizes to accommodate both small and large households





What to add

- Monitor and track employment data
- Monitor and track industrial land supply and demand
- Facilitate small, local businesses in new commercial and mixed-use developments
- Explore opportunities to introduce neighbourhood commercial uses within residential areas
- Advocate for regulatory controls on large-scale pollution activities
- · Support the creation of business improvement areas in the District





- Explore policies that promote urban biodiversity, minimize habitat fragmentation, and manage rainwater in new developments
- Make deconstruction (not demolition) of buildings a requirement
- Advocate for removal of pesticide use
- Continue to educate the public about GHG emissions and our ecological footprint




